Chalmette to Algiers Bridge Proposed in Resolution

The St. Bernard Parish Police jury took steps on the 25 of October to learn if a tri-parish Mississippi River Bridge Authority can build the proposed Chalmette to Algiers bridge.

The action, in the form of a resolution, came at a special meeting in the Chalmette Court-house.

The resolution also urged that

Thanksgiving

THE BIRTH OF THANKSGIVING

THANKSGIVING DAY had its birth by a proclamation of the President of the District of Columbia and by the Governors of the various States. The custom was originated by the pilgrims in 1621, following their first harvest. About 10 years later several colonies set aside a day for prayer and thanks until in 1680 the Massachusetts Bay Colony designated the day as a holiday.

The Governors of these Colonies appointed the date for thanksgiving and the Continental Congress made provision for the days of thanksgiving annually during the Revolution, with the exception of 1777.

In 1789 Washington proclaimed a day for offering thanks and again in 1795.

Acting upon a resolution of Congress, President Madison declared a day of thanks after the war of 1812. By 1858, Thanksgiving Day was observed in 25 States and 2 Territories.

In 1864 Lincoln designated the last Thursday of November for Thanksgiving, and each President followed the precedent.

In 1939, F. D. Roosevelt moved Thanksgiving Day a week forward and observance by the State was divided in 1939, 1949 and 1941.

In 1941 Congress made legal the former day of the observance.
