## THERE IS NO CONFLICT Catholic Church And American Constitution

The American Catholic "sees no conflict between the Catholic Church and the American Constitution. He contends that the influence which his religion has in shaping his attitude is in harmony with, and not in conflict with, the American tradition."

"He loves his Country and its Constitution with depth and devotion. When he offers himself for public office, he offers himself as a defender of the American system and as one who prefers it to any other on earth."

Thus did Sen. Thomas J. Dodd of Connecticut comment on an "illusion" which, he said, "is being widely discussed today: the assumption that a person's religious convictions should not intrude upon his official actions as a public servant."

Delivering the commencement address at Trinity College in Burlington, Vt., Sen. Dodd asserted, "One can hardly open a newspaper or a magazine without observing some reference to the question of whether or not a Catholic is qualified to serve as President of the United States."

"Some Catholics in public life have been eager to assure the voters that their religion will have nothing to do with their conduct in public office, thus fostering the idea that one's private creed should be somehow compartmentalized and isolated from his public acts."

He praised the comment by Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey of Minnesota that it should not be a matter of any importance to the American voter whether a candidate for office was a Pro-

testant, a Catholic or a Jew: What is important is that he have a religion, that he believe in it deeply, that he seek Divine guidance and that he apply his moral convictions to his political life.

"I do not presume to speak for the American Catholic in public life," said Sen. Dodd, "but my experience in that position and the challenge which is presently being made to Catholics to justify their public role has led me to formulate my own estimate of the attitudes and the responsibilities of American Catholics on the question of church and state."

"In the realm of faith and morals, the representative American Catholic embraces the doctrines of his Church by a free act of his free will, without reservation, without exception, without apology."

"In the realm of the political relationship between religion and politics, the American Catholic embraces the American tradition of separation of church and state."



"He is thankful that in this Country those of his Faith and of other faiths are spared the persecutions they have suffered in the past and continue to suffer today in other lands, and he opposes the persecution of religious minorities anywhere."

"He does not seek for his Church the privileged position accorded it in some Countries, just as his non-Catholic neighbors do not seek for their churches the privileged position they enjoy in other lands."

**TUNNIED VEAL**

2 pounds leg of veal without bones	1/4 pound italian tuna fish in olive oil
2 salted anchovies	2 anchovies
1/2 onion	2 teaspoons lemon juice
2 cloves	1/2 teaspoon capers in vinegar
1 bay leaf	1/2 to 3/4 cup olive oil (amount varies according to oil and liquid contained in other ingredients)
1 carrot	
1 stalk celery	
2 sprogs parsley	
1 teaspoon salt	

Remove fat and tendons from veal. Clean 2 salted anchovies, removing heads, tails and backbones, split them and cut into 8 pieces each. Lard the veal with anchovy pieces, and tie meat to hold it in shape. Place enough water to cover meat in large pot, add 1/2 onion, into which 2 cloves have been stuck, bay leaf, carrot, celery, parsley and salt and bring water to boiling point. Add meat, cover and cook

When veal is done, remove from pan and dry it. Mix together tuna fish, anchovies, lemon juice, capers and add olive oil a little at time, mixing and blending well until sauce is smooth and fluid and is sufficient in quantity to cover meat, let meat stand in this marinade 2 or 3 days. Serve veal cold, sliced thin and with sauce poured over. Serves 8.

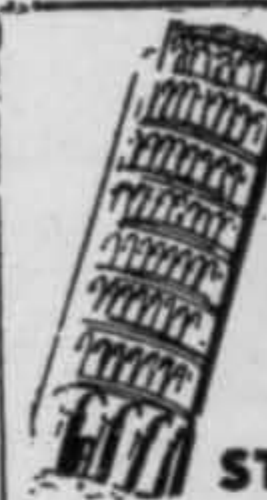

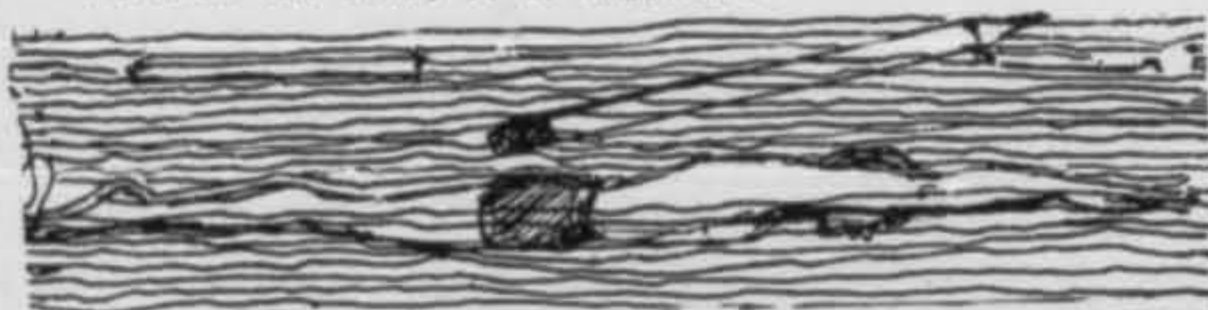


## Learn to Swim

How to swim, is the first of many articles to be illustrated on this subjects, all sports ranging from swimming to type rope walking, depends upon how well we perform in two main activities, one is balancing the other is timing.

In the teaching of swimming, timing may be left until a future lesson, but balancing should be taught the very first of all.

As an example a pencil is heavier on the eraser end, goes beneath the surface, while the point is extended upward. This is the first demonstration of balance. The second a piece of cardboard is cut in a strip form laid flat on the surface of the water, it will float, that way for hours before becoming water soaked and sinking. But if the cardboard is bent so that it cannot lay flatly on the water, it may float for a few minutes on its largest portion but will soon turn on its side and sink, it is unbalanced.

Now going back to our first demonstration, our head is the heaviest part of our body representing the rubber end of a lead pencil, if we hold our hands out in front of us so that they extended flatly on the surface of the water, (which should be shoulders high) put head forward into the water, legs extending back stiff, without arching feet pointing outward, being parallel to the legs as much as anatomy will permit. Then pushing off from the bottom of the pool, we will find our body floating on top of the water on our stomach, the same as the match and the cardboard floated, because of being well balanced.

Of course you may only float this way as long as your head is under water and you are holding your breath. Next do the same thing on your back bending your head backwards, until the water is almost up to your mouth, when floating on the surface of the water your feet have risen to a parallel position you may breathe and float on your back as long as you remain in that balancing pose, but soon as you raise your head upward you will sink.

If you learn to float on both your stomach and back you have conquered the first step of water balancing and you no longer will have any fear of drowning. This is enough for the first lesson. The use of your arms and legs will be taught in the next article.

## American History

MARCH 5, 1825



On March 5, 1825 — 135 years ago — Hans Balatka, pioneer of music in the Middle West, was born in Moravia. He was one of those emigré who came to the United States after the failure of the 1848 democratic revolution in Europe. A conductor and composer of merit, he became the foremost musical figure of his time in the Middle West. He founded the Milwaukee Musikverein and was its director for a number of years. He also founded the Chicago Liederkreis and the Balatka Academy of Musical

Art in Chicago, and was conductor of the Chicago Philharmonic Society. He was the first to perform Beethoven's symphonies in Chicago, kept orchestral music of all kinds alive over a period of many years, and lived to see the formation of the distinguished Chicago Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of another great musical pioneer of that time—Theodore Thomas.

"He is grateful that in America his Church is not encumbered with the political entanglements and temporal problems which the circumstances of history have forced upon it in other countries.

"He is thankful that the growth of our Constitutional system has abolished the practice which permitted various religious faiths in the American States to occupy the preferred status of established religions at the time our Constitution was adopted.

"The representative American Catholic does not seek to make his religious code of personal conduct binding upon all by making it the law of the land.

"He does not seek public support for the activities of his religion, though he may seek a rightful share in those public services and benefits which, according to the Supreme Court, do not involve a violation of the concept of separation of church and state.

"His attitude toward the priests and bishops who make up the hierarchy of his Church is one of respect, reverence and gratitude. He regards them as protagonists in the great drama of spiritual salvation. He looks to them for instruction in matters of faith and morals.

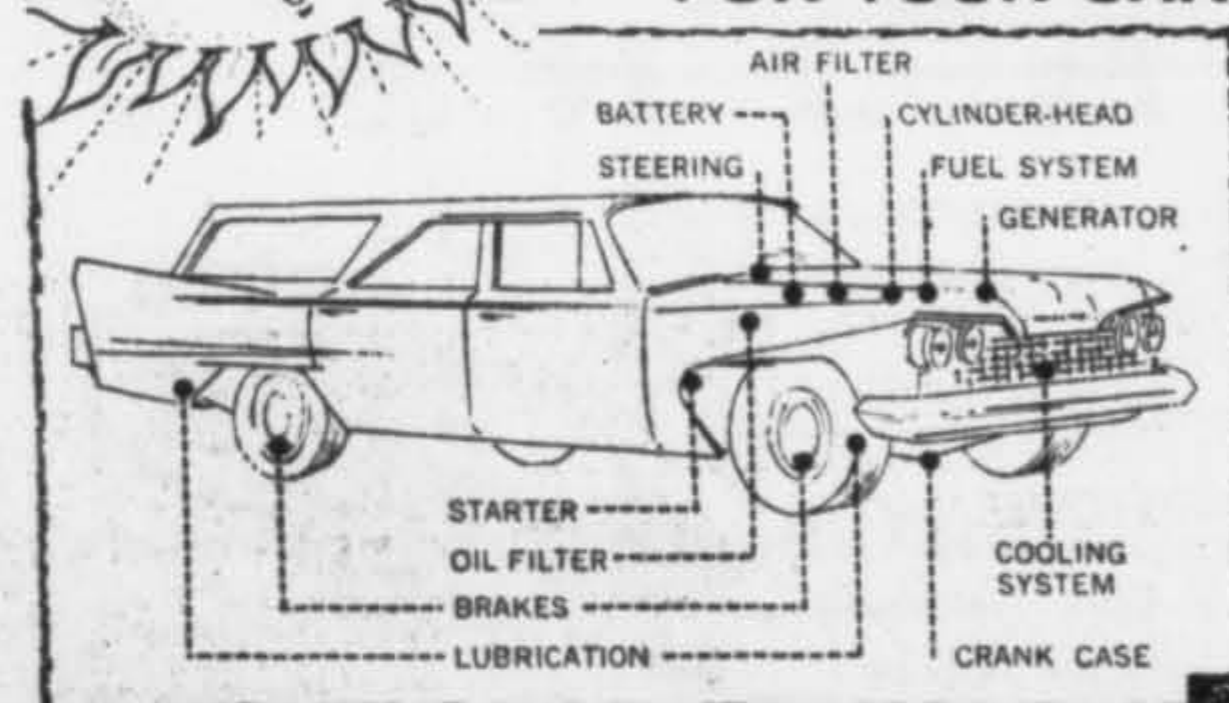

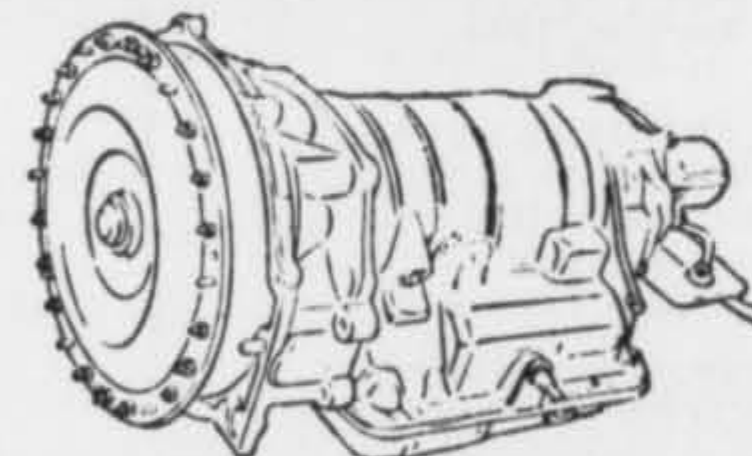
