CASH PRIZE OF TWO MILLION LIRE (ca. \$3,000.00 DOLLARS) AND A GOLD MEDAL, IS OFFERED BY THE ITALIAN MINISTRY.

The Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs has established a prize of two million lire (ca. 3,000.00 dollars) and a gold medal for an unpublished study or monograph on an aspect, a figure or figures of the Italian Risorgimento (1848-1861).

The competition is open only to non-Italian scholars and to Italian scholars residing permanently abroad.

The study may be written in any language and must reach the "Ministero degli Affari Esteri Direzione Generale delle Relazioni Culturali - Ufficio 11 - Roma (Italia)" in five typewritten copies on or before June 30th, 1962 by registered mail.

ALITALIA CONTINUES HIGH RATE OF GROWTH

Continuing a rate of growth well above the average among international air carriers, Alitalia, the national airline of Italy, met the challenge of a sharp rise in seating capacity by registering an impressive 93% increase in North Atlantic passenger traffic for May.

According to figures released by Fabrizio Serena, General Manager for North America, Alitalia flew a total of 7,117 passengers in both directions between the gateways of New York, Boston and Montreal and London, Milan and Rome, compared to 3,687 carried during the same month in 1960.

Breakdown of these traffic figures results in 4,090 eastbound passengers, compared with 2,091 flown during May of 1960 representing a 96% increase. Westbound, 3,027 passengers were carried, against 1,596 for May of last year, marking an increase of 90%.

During the five month January 1st through May 31st period, Alitalia's traffic growth was an even more impressive 103% over the corresponding five months a year ago. In expectation on continued increasing public preference for Alitalia, the Italian flag carrier increased the seating capacity over its North Atlantic routes by 135% during the first 5 months of the year.

"I am fully confident that Alitalia will maintain during the coming months of heavy tourist traffic to Europe the rate of growth registered since the beginning of the year", Mr. Serena stated.

Alitalia's reservations held for June through August period for flights to Europe are over 24% above the number of booking held at this time last year for the corresponding period.

"A definite new trend of extremely late bookings among prospective travelers strengthens our belief in a continued high rate of growth", Mr. Serena added.

Wider recognition of Alitalia's high quality service to Europe; convenient non-stop service from New York to London; all DC-8 jet schedules over the North Atlantic; and the continued growing appeal of Italy among Americans as an ideal vacation spot the year round, were other factors advanced by Mr. Serena to explain the airline's dramatic penetration in the North Atlantic market.

Alitalia's 18 DC-8 jet flights per week to Europe during the summer season include 3 week-end non-stop flights between New York and Rome; 5 non-stop schedules a week from New York to London and 4 non-stop to Milan; and 3 weekly flights to Europe from both Boston and Montreal, including a non-stop flight between Boston and Rome, which makes Alitalia the only carrier offering non-stop service between Boston and Rome and daily services direct to Milan from points in North America.

FIRST OF A SERIAL OF BARBER HISTORY

The Barber Profession declined in the year 1745 and on December 5, 1887 steps were taken for its Rebirth. However when prices for hair cut were increased from 50 cents to 1.50 in recent years the Barber Profession was again on the decline most of the so called barbers restricted them selves to hair cutting only and completely dissolved them selves from barbering or practicing Barber Science.

THE HISTORY OF THE BARBER PROFESSION

The barber profession is one of the oldest profession in the history of the world. Some of the earliest written records of Egypt and China refer to the practice of barbering, and several passages of the Bible allude to barbers and their craft. In 500 B.C. barbering became quite an art in Greece when trimmed beards were in vogue. Barbering became very popular in Rome where it was introduced in 296 B.C.

In the early years of the Christian era, barbers became assistants to the clergy. They did the surgical work in the treatment of diseases, which in those days consisted only of bloodletting, and they became known as the barber surgeons.

The year 1096 marks the date of the first barber organization in France, which established the first school for the study of surgery in Paris for barber surgeons. This school became a model for many such school during the middle ages.

In 1163 A.D. the clergy were forbidden their surgical practice on sacrilegious grounds. The barber surgeons took over their relinquished practice, and to a large extent became the only surgeons for over 600 years thereafter. At this time the barber surgeons also practiced tooth-pulling, which practically constituted the entire practice of dentistry.

In the 14th century, however, the science of medicine and surgery began to grow to such an extent that the barber surgeons began to find it hard to keep up with the practice of surgery, dentistry and barbering at the same time, and in 1450 the guild of surgeons began to surpass them with their more specialized skill and more adequate knowledge, and succeeded by act of parliament in restricting the barber only to bloodletting, tooth-pulling and cauterizing.

N.O.-Italy Trade Increase Seen

Increased trade relations between New Orleans and Italy have been forecast by W. Richard White, Jefferson Parish bank executive.

Reporting by mail on his European tour, which began April 27 and included France, Spain, Switzerland and Italy, White said Italy's industrial community expressed "interest in the advantages in the New Orleans area."

"Through these groups," he continued, "we met others who showed keen interest in our economic and industrial development in Jefferson parish and elsewhere along the Mississippi river between Baton Rouge and the Gulf."

White took the tour to urge use of the port of New Orleans as a market outlet for world trade.

He is scheduled to return this month and later meet with representatives of the International Trade House to make his observations of trade relations as concern New Orleans.

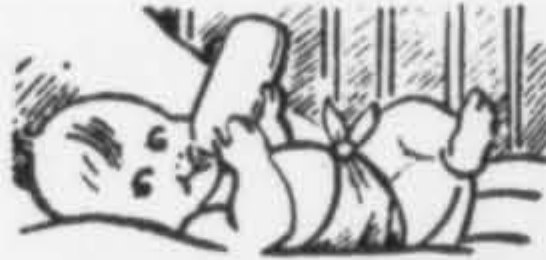

Per il primo trimestre del 1961, l'indice della produzione del petrolio greggio (base media mensile 1953:100) ha avuto il seguente andamento (tra parentesi l'indice dei corrispondenti mesi del 1960): gennaio 212,7 (192,7), febbraio 229,8 (188,2), marzo 220,6 (205,7).

Il mercato dei carburanti si muove su basi di prezzo invariate sia per le benzine da autotrazione normale, che per il supercarburante, come per le qualità di uso agricolo. Le notevoli disponibilità e la man-

canza di richiesta per riscaldamento hanno determinato, per gli olii combustibili per forni e caldaie, un ulteriore ribasso di lire 10 al quintale nei prezzi di libero mercato del tipo denso superiore a 10 gradi, e, sia nelle vendite da costiero, che in quelle da deposito commerciante o consumatore, invariati gli altri tipi di nafta.

L'indice di produzione della benzina, sempre per lo stesso periodo (tra parentesi l'indice dei corrispondenti mesi del 1960) ha avuto il seguente andamento (base: media mensile 1953: 100): gennaio 219,9 (189,2) febbraio 189,4 (190,1), marzo 237 (219,3).

Su basi regolari di rifornimenti e di consegne si è mantenuto nella prima quindicina di maggio, il mercato dei combustibili fossili. I prezzi hanno registrato le consuete variazioni stagionali con spunti di lieve ripresa per determinate qualità tra le quali le antraciti russa e tedesca.

BLESSED JOHN'S STATUE ON WAY

To Be Placed in National Shrine Here

The marble statue, which will be placed in the recently dedicated St. Dominic's church, Harrison near Canal blvd., will be completed later in the year. It is the work of Prof. O. P. Orlandini, noted Italian sculptor.
