Why have such a program? I like this goal posted on the **Bird Town PA website**: "It is our vision to build highways of sustenance and safety to counterbalance the tremendous loss of living space for birds, plants, and all native species."

What makes an outdoor space bird-friendly? Using native plants in landscaping and gardens, and reducing bird collisions with windows. And providing the following:

- Food: berries, seeds, nectar.
- Water: clean water for drinking, bathing.
- **Shelter:** Safe haven for nesting and protection from predators.
- Nesting: Trees, shrubs, nest boxes.

Our **PIA Bird Habitat Recognition** sign has been designed and production is underway! The sign on your property will be a wonderful conversation starter with friends and neighbors. **Check out an image of the sign on the next page!**

A celebration of the life of former PIA Board member Ken Andersen, who died on May 1, will be held on Monday, August 18 from 3:30 - 7:30 P.M at the Rotary Pavilion on Presque Isle State Park. Feel free to come and go according to your schedule! This is an opportunity for family and friends to gather and share stories and memories of Ken, to laugh, and enjoy a cold beverage along with sweet and savory snacks.





From the minute ruby-throated hummingbird to the soaring red-shouldered hawk, birds are essential to our ecosystems. They are also increasingly in need of our protection. On **August 12**, **Erie Gives Day and Crawford Gives Day**, make a difference by supporting birds and their habitats through the **Presque Isle Audubon Society (PIAS)**.

Erie is a bird's (and birders'!) paradise. **Presque Isle**, with its protected and ecologically sensitive habitat, serves as an extremely important stop for migrating and nesting birds. It is also the home of the annual **Festival of the Birds**, our weekend-long event that brings 150 people immersed in the wonders of spring migration. PIAS' programs are designed to connect people to not only birds, but nature as a whole. For example, our **Nurture the Nature Lover program** reached 400 students last school year, bringing environmental education to classrooms to inspire the next generation of conservationists.

Our other programs include:

• **Scholarships to two educators** in the Erie area to attend a week of nature education training at **Hog Island**, Maine, where they learn to inspire a love for nature in students.

- Free and open to the public, guided bird hikes throughout the year.
- Stewardship of three nature sanctuaries.
- Conducting the yearly PA Christmas Bird Count.

We consider everyone that has stopped to appreciate the familiar song of a robin, the beautiful coloring of a cardinal, or the quiet grace of a heron to be a birder. Join us on **August 12**, **Erie Gives Day and Crawford Gives Day**, in our efforts to save birds and their habitats.

PIA Grants in Action: New Projects at Asbury Woods Made Possible through Community Partnerships

Asbury Woods was able to complete some exciting upgrades thanks to project grants from **Presque Isle Audubon**. Three projects were able to be completed: **a native bird wingspan display**, **a video bird feeder**, **and a backyard birding workshop**. All three have received great feedback from Asbury Woods' visitors.

The "Measure Your Wingspan" display allows visitors to compare their "wingspan" to those of several native birds. This display is part of the *Wild About Wildlife! Discovering Pennsylvania's Native Species* exhibit, which was installed in January 2025. As an interactive addition to the Nature Center, the display allows people to learn about native bird species in an engaging way. They can then explore those species further throughout the rest of the exhibit. The display was designed and installed by local company Scalise Enterprises.

The **video bird feeder** is another interactive addition to Asbury Woods, made possible by the funding from Presque Isle Audubon. The feeder has been a great way to get video footage of our resident birds and share that with the public. Moving forward, Asbury Woods plans to invite the public to connect to our feed and will use footage in a current video project with **WQLN**.

Lastly, Asbury Woods hosted a "Backyard Birding Workshop" where over 20 participants learned about basic birding etiquette, how to identify common PA songbirds utilizing both bird calls and colors, as well as decorating a bird house to take home to continue bird watching with. This program was a huge success, bringing people of all ages together with a common interest in birds. Due to its popularity, Asbury Woods is excited to host a monthly "Bird Tour" to encourage workshop participants and anyone else interested to join us for a birdwatching walk around different parts of Asbury Woods.

With support from organizations like **Presque Isle Audubon**, Asbury Woods can continue to offer our community the opportunity to discover something new. To learn more about the world around them and what awaits right outside their door.





Black Tern—1; June 3; Edinboro Lake; J.H. 1; June 30; Big Pond; C.L.

Black-crowned Night-Heron—1; June 5; Carter Hill Rd.; T.K.

American White Pelican—9; June 10; circling over Erie; J.L.

Western Kingbird—1; July 10; Gull Point trail; J.B.

Yellow-breasted Chat—1; June 11; East Springfield; K.A. 1; June 30; Howard Eaton Reservoir; T.L.

Connecticut Warbler—1; June 11; East Springfield; K.A.; Latest county record by at least two weeks.

Blackpoll Warbler—1; through July 21; Presque Isle; Jason; record late in the county by about two weeks
