
# **REST IN PEACE POPE FRANCIS**

We heard just before 9.00am on Easter Monday. The radio was on and the host of the Today programme on Radio 4 began to announce in sombre tones some breaking news from Reuters agency: the Vatican has just announced that Pope Francis has died at 7.35 this morning. A feeling of deep sadness came over me. On Easter Sunday, we had watched him on the TV, at the Easter Mass in St Peter's making his appearance on the balcony. He looked so frail and his voice was so weak, yet he managed to give his message: Dear brothers and sisters - Happy Easter. His last message to his flock was to wish the world all the joy and hope of the Resurrection. Thousands of people were deeply touched by his determination to carry out his duty as our pastor, and this love for him as pastor of his flock has been vividly demonstrated by the numbers who filed past his coffin as he lay in state in St Peter's and who attended his funeral mass. He has now been laid to rest in St Mary Major, the basilica he loved so much.

His words to us have always been ones which have spoken of God's love for each one of us. Each week in our newsletter we have received an extract from his Angelus address on the Gospel of the day: a little piece of wisdom from him illuminating in his own unique style. the way in which Jesus is alive in our lives, with us on our journey, consoling us with his mercy and offering us his forgiveness and the hope which we all need in our lives. In his very first Angelus message he recounted a conversation that he had with an elderly lady who wished to make confession:

An elderly woman approached me, humble, very humble, and over eighty years old. I looked at her, and I said, "Grandmother" — because in our country that is how we address the elderly — do you want to make your confession?". "Yes", she said to me. "But if you have not sinned...". And she said to me: "We all have sins...". "But perhaps the Lord does not forgive them". "The Lord forgives all things", she said to me with conviction. "But how do you know, Madam?". "If the Lord did not forgive everything, the world would not exist". I felt an urge to ask her: "Tell me. Madam. did vou study at the Gregorian [University]?". because that is the wisdom which the Holy Spirit gives: inner wisdom focused on God's mercy. Let us not forget this word: God never ever tires of forgiving us! "Well, Father what is the problem?". Well, the problem is that we ourselves tire, we do not want to ask, we grow weary of asking for forgiveness. He never tires of forgiving, but at times we get tired of asking for forgiveness. Let us never tire, let us never tire! He is the loving Father who always pardons, who has that heart of mercy for us all. And let us too learn to be merciful to everyone. Let us invoke the intercession of Our Lady who held in her arms the Mercy of God made man.

May the God of mercy now hold him in his arms and grant him his eternal rest.
