#### THINKING ABOUT THE TRINITY

It is probably fair to say that that we always struggle when we turn our minds and our thoughts to the Trinity. Thankfully we can also say that we are not alone in this struggle. Remember it took the Church over 300 years before a doctrinal formula about the Trinity and its mystery came to fruition. This year we celebrate to 17 hundredth anniversary of that great moment when the Council of Nicaea produced the Creed which we proclaim at Mass each week. Looking at this creed we find that it is apportioned between statements about God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit in a way that brings their oneness into a comprehensive unity through a profound reflection on the mystery that is God.

Our struggle in seeking to explore the Godhead should not be a frustrating or a limiting conundrum. We appreciate that our language can seem inadequate, yet we can nevertheless use our minds to reference the experience of God as truly expansive and inspiring. The creed begins with words of affirmation and trust, a step which opens the door into this mystery. We have entered into a moment in which we acknowledge something about ourselves. We are limited and partial creatures with questions and struggles about ourselves, our purpose and our place in the cosmos. Therefore, we need a road map to navigate our pathway to understanding. Faith and reason now become companions on this pathway, capable of walking hand in hand in seeking the truth. We should not be frightened or afraid of this pairing because they both seek the "how" and the "why" of our questioning. God is big enough to enable our science and our religion to both breathe the same air and to generate from that air a hope that will inspire and assimilate the beauty which is the fruit of them both for the benefit of understanding.

In the gospel this weekend we have some profound words from Jesus, "I still have many thigs to say to you". They are profound because of what the imply about the very thing which limits us; time. We want all the answers and explanations, and we want them now. This is not a good way of seeking answers to a mystery. The creed ends with an acknowledgement of this reality. Its last line acknowledges that we await a revelation that is as yet unknown, described as the life of the world to come. Therein lies the hope into which our faith and our reason converge, the mystery that is the Trinity, Father, Son and Spirit.
