It is a very profound observation, one which many of us would probably recognise. Indeed, I had to admit and tell the parishioner that no, I can't say that I have actually heard God saying anything to me. But then do I really expect him to say anything to me? I don't think I do, no voices in the night, no apparitions in the day. Maybe it does happen to people, but so far it ain't happened to me. But to be honest, I have no expectation that it should happen to me so what do I say in response to the question. I say: yes, God does talk to me and answer prayer. He speaks to me through the people around me. My wife, my children, my family, my friends, my fellow parishioners, my community and so on. God speaks to me with your voice and with your thoughts and through you he tells me that I am loved. You are the voice of God lifting me up when I'm down, carrying me when I fall, reviving me when I'm exhausted. He speaks to me in the Scriptures, and I encounter him in and through the sacraments, just as you do and just as the millions of others who through their faith in Jesus, truly live out what he calls them to be by living with him a relationship of love.

Saints and Feasts of the Week: Monday 11 August St Clare (1193-1253) A friend of Francis of Assisi who following his example, left home and formed a community of women which later grew into the order of the Poor Clares. Based on poverty and the renunciation of property, the sisters were sustained by almsgiving. For many years in our Diocese a convent of Poor Clare Sisters was based at Bulwell in the Parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour. We thank them for their great witness and testimony to the contemplative way of life they lived. Thursday 14 August St Maximillian Kolbe (1894-1941) A Polish priest who spent time in Japan founding missions but also travelled to India and Russia eventually returning back to Poland in 1939 due to ill health. He began a ministry of caring for and sheltering many from the Jewish Community which lead to his arrest and being sent to Auschwitz, where he gave his life in exchange for another prisoner. The man he saved by his deed of great sacrifice was present at his canonisation. Friday 15 August The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Solemnity. The commemoration of the death of Our Lady and of her assumption ,body and soul into heaven. It is Mary's role in the economy of salvation which we remember on this feast day. From the outset her life was one in which her role is modelled on the affirmation of her Son as the one who is the save his people. As she moves her way in and through the Gospel and into the Acts of the Apostles, she becomes the epitome of the ideal disciple or follower of Jesus.
