THE COUNSEL OF GOD

Luke continues his gospel account with Jesus delivering his message with very strong language. As we know he is journeying towards Jerusalem, and his mind would have been filled with what he knew was awaiting him. As such he is intent on providing his disciples, in no uncertain terms, with the prospect which awaits both him and more likely than not, his followers. Jesus has spoken to the crowds about the need to strive to enter through the narrow door. Of how our attitude and response to his invitation is to be expressed through deeds of humility and meekness. In effect he is telling them do not take this road if you wish to be honoured in the sight of men because you won't be. Rather they should understand that the journey being taken, will result in them being rejected by the world. To reinforce this Jesus lays before them the image of the messianic banquet to which neither the great nor the good of the world will be invited, but rather the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame, and they will take the seats of honour. Such an image confounds his followers, and to drive home this reality for them he tells them: whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Wow. His language is hard and is framed in a very particular and personal way – you have to hate your father, mother, wife, children, brother, sisters, yes and your own life too. It brings to mind the question the author of the Book of Wisdom asks in our first reading. What human being can learn the counsel of God? The words of Jesus offer an extraordinary insight into what was on Jesus' mind as he trod that road to Jerusa-

So what do we think? Does Jesus really mean that we as disciples should literally hate our family? Remember he is laying before his followers a dramatic moment of crisis. A moment of judgement for each one of them and for us. What is it that you hold dearest and closest to you, and is this going to prevent and stop you from accepting the invitation to the banquet? This crisis, this cross must be confronted. We recognise it most famously in Peter's profession of faith at Caesarea Philippi. Peter wants Christ on his terms and not God's and so he is rebuked in no uncertain terms by Jesus. Get behind me Satan, you are thinking like man and not like God. The guestion from the Book of Wisdom comes to mind again. We then have to ask ourselves the same question. On what terms do I want God in my life? If it's on my terms, then the cross can have no meaning for me, since I see the world and those around me as simply a means to an end. If however, I see the cross as the path through which every human endeavour is directed towards the transforming of that end, then the mind of Christ has entered into my reality. Consequently, it shapes my thoughts, it shapes my actions, and it shapes my understanding. I have entered into a new and profound relationship with God through the cross of Christ. It is a relationship which transcends human relationships, and it changes the world around us, and it is why St Paul was able to attest he was not ashamed of the cross and neither should we be. ## Saints and Feasts of the Week:

Monday 8 September: Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The birthday of Mary also known a Marymas is not mentioned in the canon of Scripture. It seems that the most likely source of information for this event derives from the apocryphal text known as the proto-Evangelium of James, a document which is dated to the later years of the second century. It is from this text that we are told of the names of Mary's parents, Joachim and Anne. The story follows a pattern of birth as told in the Old Testament in particular the account of the birth of Sammuel. The date of the feast 8 September resonates with the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception eight months earlier. The feast has been celebrated from about the beginning of the sixth century when following the Council of Ephesus in 431 proclaimed Mary Mother of God.

Saturday 13 September: St. John Chrysostom (348-407) "Chrysostom" means Golden mouth. John was born in Antioch and is recognised in the Church as a great preacher and doctor of the Church. He rose to become Patriarch of Constantinople at a time when the city was entering the zenith of its power and status as the capital of the Roman Empire. He lived a very austere life in contrast to the Imperial Court. He clashed a number of times with the Empress leading to several periods of exile, during one of which he died.
