This weekend, the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross takes precedence over the Ordinary Sunday of the Year, and hence our reading of the Gospel of Luke is interrupted and in its place the Gospel of John is read. The feast is an ancient one reaching back into the early centuries of the Church. Indeed, it commemorates the discovery of the relic of the true cross iby Helena mother of the Emperor Constantine in Jerusalem. The relic was then installed in the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre to be "exalted" (shown or displayed) before pilgrims and worshippers. It is this "exaltation" or "lifting up" which mimics the description Jesus himself conveys to Nicodemus, when he speaks of how he, the Son of Man, "must be lifted up". Similarly in the reading from the letter to the Philippians, St Paul quotes an early Christian hymn which uses the same term to describe how by accepting death on a cross, Jesus is then "highly exalted".

The phrase therefore has a unique and specific significance in expressing our understanding of the nature and importance of this moment. For us as Christians, the crucifixion of Jesus is both a shattering and salvific moment at the same time. Shattering because of its shame and ignominy. Jesus dies the death of a common criminal. His disciples are horrified at what they witness, and they are left distraught and bereft at what they now perceive is the complete collapse of all they had hoped for. The Messiah, as prophesised throughout the scriptures has been crushed. But has he? Read once more what is written in the Book of Numbers: "make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it will live." Read the prophet Zechariah: "they will look on the one they have pierced...and a fountain will be opened to wash away sin and impurity away." Read the prophet Isaiah: "see my servant will prosper and rise to great heights...after the ordeal he will see the light...as he was bearing the sins of many." Read the words of John the Baptist: "look, there is the lamb of God that takes away the sins of the world." This is the salvific moment when the true nature of Jesus' Messiahship is revealed. The cross is transformed by the resurrection into the transcendent mystery which St John defines uniquely as Jesus' "glorification", the moment when, as Jesus himself predicted the Law and the Prophets have been completed. The cross is not as St Paul said the "scandal which the Jews cannot overcome nor the folly which the Greeks find absurd". The cross is the means through which the Divine mercy of the Father vindicates his love for the world.

What then when we look at the cross, what do we see? Obstacles and absurdity or love? The death of Jesus confounds our world, but to be his disciple we are called to take up the cross and follow him. This means bringing with us all the baggage of our lives, all the things which make us the persons we are, the good, the bad and the ugly. The obstacles we can't overcome and the absurdities we feel incapable of fathoming and in that moment of decision they are lifted up, overcome and subsumed in the Divine Mercy.

Saints and Feasts of the Week:

Monday 15th September: Our Lady of Sorrows Previously known as the "Seven Sorrows of Our Lady" it recalls the traumas Mary went through during the life of her son Jesus. The mass of this feast contains the famous sequence "Stabat Mater" which is now sung when the praying of the Stations of the Cross

Tuesday 16th September: Sts Cornelius (-253) and Cyprian (210-258). Cornelius became Pope in 251. He fought against the Novation schism (refusal to readmit the lapsed) along with his great ally Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage. Under a persecution of the Church by the Roman Emperor Decius all citizens were required to sacrifice to the Roman gods forcing Christians to choose between apostasy and martyrdom.

Saturday 20th September: Sts Andrew Tae-gon & Companions. The Korean Church has the unique claim of being founded entirely by lay people, who withstood wave after wave of persecutions and in less than a century could boast of 10,000 martyrs. Andrew Tae-gon the first priest Korean priest was martyred in 1846. This day celebrates the martyrdom over a 100 lay men and women and children.
