Saints and Feasts of the Week:

**Tuesday 23 September: St Pius of Pietrelcina (1887-1968).** Affectionately known as Padre Pio, he was a Capuchin friar at the monastery of San Giovanni in Rotondo, sought after as a spiritual director and confessor and intercessor and may miracles were ascribed to him. He died a few days after the 50 anniversary of his having received the stigmata. It is recorded that over 100,000 persons attended his funeral.

Wednesday 24 September: Our Lady of Walsingham. In 1061 the Lady of the Manor in Walsingham Norfolk, received a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary and was instructed to build a replica of the house in Nazareth where the Annunciation took place. It soon became a shrine and a great centre of pilgrimage in medieval times. The original shrine was destroyed in the Reformation but was rebuilt and has once more established its place as a place of pilgrimage becoming in 1943 the National Shrine of Our Lady.

Saturday 27 September: St Vincent de Paul (1581-1660). He was born in Aquitaine, France and following his priestly ordination he devoted his life to the service of the poor. He founded a congregation of priests for missionary work and laypersons for the help of the poor. To this day the St Vincent de Paul Society universally known as the SVP is a great parochial ministry which attends to the needs of the poor in the local community.
