THE WEEK AHEAD – THE MONDAY, TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY

Saturday 28th March: Lenten Feria
9.30am ST : Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
10.30am St : Holy Mass

Most of us are I'm sure, pretty well acquainted with the Thursday Friday and Saturday of Holy Week known as the Easter Triduum, but what about the first three days, the Monday Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week. The readings at Mass for these days offer deep insights into this most sacred of weeks. **Monday-** Isaiah dominates the First Readings of these three days with his powerful poetry describing the work of the Servant of the Lord, the enigmatic figure who takes on the cause of the people as a vicarious offering of suffering. It seems beyond doubt that Jesus took these readings as a pattern for his own mission. I have appointed you as covenant of the people and light of the nations, to open the eyes of the blind to free captives from prison and those who live in darkness from the dungeon. The Gospel is of John and describes the anointing of Jesus by Mary at Bethany. It is a prefiguring of Jesus' anointing at his death. The smell of the perfume is unavoidable. There is to be no hiding, this moment dominates the proceedings and as a result plots and decisions of one sort and are made. **Tuesday** - The Lord, through Isaiah again calls out to the Servant; It is not enough for you to be my servant, to restore the tribes of Jacob...I will make you the light of the gentiles so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the world. The moment in the Last Supper when the treachery of Judas is exposed is now related. It is the moment when all motives and none are laid bare as Simon's pledge is challenged. What bitterness and sorrow now emerge as the rawness of human emotion is displayed and is found to be wanting. Only Jesus knows what is to happen. **Wednesday** - The Servant is now offered up, given a disciples tongue and yet Jesus will be silent in front of his accusers. He takes the part offering his cheek, offering himself. The Supper continues and the plot has been hatched. Judas makes his reply to Jesus "Not I Rabbi surely?" "They are your own words" answered Jesus.
