Last week we celebrated Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit which Jesus promised would be sent by the Father and himself as a manifestation of the love that sustains all relationships. Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Trinity, the loving relationship of Father, Son and Spirit. There is a beautiful line in Psalm 101 in which our desire for meaning and understanding is placed before God. The psalmist prays "Lord listen to my cry for help, do not hide your face from me in the day of distress, turn your ear towards me and answer me quickly when I call". And what is God's response to our ceaseless pleading and crying to him in our need? The gift of Jesus. His face is the face of God. His ears are the ears of God. His love is the love of God. In the Gospel of today we read that God so loved the world that he gave, viz gifted us, his Son. We need to understand just what that signifies. It is in Jesus that all our prayers find their answer. It is through him that our meaning finds its purpose.

On Monday 25 May Pope Leo published his first Encyclical teaching document, "Magnifica Humanitas." The subject he chose to consider was the challenge to the human person of Artificial Intelligence, AI. It is a document which traces its roots right back his predecessor Leo XIII's encyclical Rerum Novarum (New Things) issued in 1891 which was fundamental in setting out the Church's position in respect to Catholic Social Teaching, including most importantly the inherent dignity of the human person regarding human rights, and their fundamental relationships, lived in truth and freedom within the workplace and within social communities. Our present Pope resolutely supports these rights and, in his teaching, seeks to apply them to the discussion and arguments regarding the development of AI. The moral, ethical and practical issues which AI will, and is already bringing to the table must be addressed. Not just with an eye towards scientific and commercial progress. but embedded within the process an appreciation and understanding of what it is that is being brought into existence and how this will impact on our social and communal lives. To quote from the document Pope Leo states: "we must lovingly safeguard the grandeur of humanity bestowed upon us and revealed in its fulness in Christ, the splendour of which no machine can ever replace." Similarly, he takes great care in reinforcing the intrinsic value of each person when addressing the enormous potential of AI by saying to us:

FEASTS OF THE WEEK
Monday 1 June: St Justin Martyr (-165) One of the earliest Christian apologists whose description of the eucharistic celebration in his work *First Apology* still resonates today with our own liturgy. He was martyred in the persecution in 165 AD under the Emperor Marcus Aurelius

Wednesday 3 June: St Charles Lwanga (-1885/70) & Comps. Charles and 21 companions were executed by Mwanga, the Ugandan King for rebuking him for his debauchery and murder of an Anglican missionary.

Friday 5 June: St Boniface of Crediton (675? - 754). A native of Devon he was a Benedictine monk chosen by Pope Gregory II to preach the gospel in Germany. He successfully founded a number of Dioceses in Eastern Germany before travelling into Holland where he was set upon and then murdered.

WORD OF THE WEEK: TRINITY
 The Trinity is a mystery that we can never fully understand, but it is a central part of our Catholic faith. The Trinity is the belief that there is one God who exists in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three persons are distinct from each other, but they are also one God. This special feast helps us reflect on how we understand God and inspires us to get to know him more closely in our lives.

Say a prayer this week to God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit and think about who God is to you.
