THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN IS AT HAND

Saturday 13th June: The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary (memorial)

Following the run of feasts and solemnities, we now return to the ordinary Sundays of the year with a bold reminder about our tasks as disciples. The joy of Easter, the gifts of Pentecost and the mystery of the Trinity are all fixed in our consciousness and now we are being asked to apply these realities into the daily events of our lives. So, what do we make of this good news?

Remember how Jesus began his ministry with this theme at its core. The euangelion, the great announcement which he proclaimed, the good news which illuminated his mind was that the kingdom or the realm of God was to be experienced and lived. It meant that issuing forth from this proclamation was a new understanding of the way in which God relates to his creation. No longer was our experience of God to be an abstraction. Instead through the revelation of Jesus, the experience was to become tangible in the most profound of ways. God becomes real to us in the flesh of a human being. Unlike the Greek and Roman gods who would appear and disappear in the form of humans as and when they chose, Jesus is the word made flesh dwelling amongst us. He becomes as we are, as St Paul says in the letter to the Philippians. He no longer clings to his equality with God but takes to himself our human condition and through this emptying, enters into the trials and tribulations, the joys and hopes of what you and me sense and feel in our lives. We should find in this reality a powerful and inspiring nexus which can never separate us from his love. Recall St Paul again: nothing can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord.

That having been said, the Easter Season with its deep experience of encountering the risen Christ, gives way to the Post Pentecostal Ordinary Season in which our encounter becomes no less deep but changed. The Jesus of the ministry with the images of his teaching, his healings and his loving deeds and acts becomes the focus which draws us to him in a unique an individual way. And as we move ever closer to him, the realm of the kingdom of heaven is more and more defined and it becomes clearer to us as to just what it means. In today's gospel Jesus looks at us with compassion and asks us to work with him in the vineyard. He sends us out to work to bring forth the harvest.

FEASTS OF THE WEEK
FERIAL DAYS: These are the days of the week when there is no allocated Saints Day, Solemnity, Feast Day or Holy day of Obligation. As a result, the prayers at Mass are usually the ones used at the Mass of the previous Sunday. The word "feria" derives from the Latin word "feriae" meaning holiday or festival. The term was adopted by the early Church in Rome as a way to avoid referencing roman pagan festival celebrations.
