Questions

- Paul warns that some may have believed “in vain.” What does it mean to believe in the resurrection “without purpose”?
- How does genuine belief in resurrection give courage to live a cruciform (crossshaped) life—sacrificial, humble, others oriented?
- How does reading the Old Testament as a story of God continually bringing life from death shape your understanding of who God is?
- Reflect personally: When have you experienced something painful or confusing later transformed into purpose and redemption?
- In your community, what practices could help sustain “resurrection hope” in the midst of painful waiting?
- How does the resurrection declare that God’s values—humility, justice, mercy—are truer and stronger than the world’s systems?
- Throughout the letter, Paul connects the cross (self-emptying love) and the resurrection (God’s vindication). How do these together define the Christian life?
