- When Paul says "Whatever you do, do in love," how might that function as a spiritual compass for every decision?
- How does love serve as both motivation and measurement in Christian life?
- How does this final lesson tie back to the letter's beginning—"the message of the cross is the power of God"?
- Summarize the main transformation Paul sought for the Corinthians. How has that same transformation begun or deepened in you?
