Questions

- Thinking about Luke's focus on memory, how are we similar to Luke's original audience? How does this emphasis on re-membering help us think about the church now?
- What do you think was getting in the way of Cleopas and his friend seeing Jesus? What gets in your way?
- Read Luke 4:1-13. List the things that the devil offers Jesus that seem like life-giving or life-enhancing things. How might this story offer us an interpretation of the angels' question to the women at the tomb: "Why do you look for the living among the dead?"
- Look up the other instances of Jesus describing his musts: Luke 2:49; 4:43; 19:5. What things can we deduce are important to God's kingdom for these musts to be divinely commanded to Jesus? How important are these things to our churches?
