Welcome

Questions

- Why might it be significant that Jesus is first seen on the road after he is raised from the dead? How might this help us understand the significance of the resurrection? (read Acts 9:3 for extra incite!)
- Like Matthew, Luke also provides an elaborate and unique birth narrative of Jesus. Read Luke 1-2 and compare the birth narrative with the resurrection. What similarities or reversals do you notice? How does the way the story begins and ends help you think about the resurrection's importance?
- Jesus is able to teach his disciples and open their minds only after he has been physically present through meals and touch. When has a relationship changed your perspective or beliefs? How might our churches take this model to heart better?
- What story or stories have been so powerful that they informed your actions? What stories have shaped your identity? How do you see that identity-shaping power in Luke's resurrection narrative?
