EDUCATION NEWS FROM JENNY

Sign-up and payment for the Terri Bay Dragonfly Mandala class has started! The cost is \$70 for the kit. The dates are October 17-18, Friday/Saturday, 9:00 to 4:00 at St. Mark's Episcopal Church. You may pay the entire \$70, or if you prefer you may pay a \$25 deposit, with the rest due September 1st.

Your full payment or deposit is due no later than the August 14th morning meeting so I can contact Terri and she can mail the kits to me during August. There is some prework, which entails stitching the satin stitch border. I am willing to set up times when we can get together and help each other with the prework. If you are not coming to the July or August meetings, you can mail a check to me, payable to Louisville Chapter EGA, at <u>3302 Haddon Rd., Louisville, 40241</u>. You don't need to fill out a coupon. Maximum class size is 22. A wait list will be kept if there are more than 22 sign-ups. Spots are first-come, first-served. Per chapter policy, if you are not able to take the class after payment and there is no waiting list, you are responsible for finding someone to take your spot and pay you for the kit.
