EDUCATION NEWS FROM JENNY

We have 16 members signed up for the Terri Bay whitework class, and registration is now closed. I should be receiving the kits in time for the September morning meeting and will hand them out at that time. There is some prework that needs to be at least a quarter of the way finished by class on October 17th. The prework involves stitching the satin border of the design. If anyone needs help with the prework, we will work out a time to get together and work on it.

The class is Friday and Saturday, Oct. 17 and 18, at St. Mark's Episcopal Church where we have our evening meetings. (2822 Frankfort Ave.) Start time will be either 9:00 or 9:30 each day, which I will confirm with Terri and let everyone know well in advance. For the class you will need a 10" or 11" hoop, Q-snap, or similar sized scroll bars, light or magnification for 28 count linen if needed, a wooden awl to open holes if desired, and usual stitching supplies.

This will make it easier and faster when someone wants to join. Also, I will be adding new pictures to the website after the September meetings which will include the upcoming chapter 2026 programs and many of our wonderful state fair awards.
