











Sailing Sustainably in Greece







Overview

We care about protecting the waters we are sailing in and supporting the coastal communities where we dock. We also want to help you be a more sustainable sailor. The top things to look out for are:

- Anchor safely to protect seagrass
- Lower your speed
- Watch wildlife at a distance and report sightings
- Buy local and sustainable
- Use marine safe products
- Leave no trace, don't pollute













Anchor safely to protect seagrass

- Anchor in sand or mud and not in seagrass
- Wear polarized sunglasses to see seagrass beds
- Tie long lines to sturdy rocks, never use trees
- Avoid anchor drag as it can damage the seabed
- When raising the anchor slowly motor towards it and retrieve it when the line is vertical.


















Avoid pollution

- Ensure holding tanks are CLOSED when at anchor or in ports and only open when in deep sea
- Use shore-based washing and toilet facilities as much as possible
- Buy marine or reef safe products such as suncream and washing up liquid: there are several brands available in supermarkets and pharmacies in Greece
- When motoring, keep speed low and not full throttle (only use one engine on catamarans) to save on fuel use and cost.



Respecting wildlife

- Watch wildlife at a distance of 100m, do not get in the water with them, and never go to shore to see them
- Do not steer boat towards wildlife, keep a **steady course** if they approach and if possible, put engine into neutral
- Do not make noise, use flash, or drones when they are near
- Report sightings of seals, dolphins, and turtles to help scientists – use QR code.

















Buy local and sustainable


- Choose sustainable fish in tavernas, like sardines and seabream, and avoid overfished species such as swordfish and mullet (see the Guide for details)
- Support local producers where you visit and shop from farmers markets and small shops instead of big supermarkets
- Try local specialties from each island ask what is unique to that place.















Leave no trace

- Keep a tidy boat to stop anything going overboard
- Leave your rubbish and recycling at designated areas
- If possible, do not leave recycling on smaller islands
- Do not use single-use plastics
- Pick up litter in the sea and on beaches when safe to do so
