## Black Women's Leadership Collective and Emerge Action Fund Launch Groundbreaking Candidate Training for Black Women in North Carolina

Raleigh, NC — Two powerhouse organizations committed to advancing women's political leadership are joining forces to launch a groundbreaking, non-partisan candidate training program tailored specifically for Black women in North Carolina. The Black Women's Leadership Collective (BWLC) and Emerge Action Fund announced today that the program will kick off with an in-person gathering on September 12–13, 2025, in Raleigh, NC.

This innovative program builds on the work of BWLC's North Carolina chapter, launched in 2024 to strengthen and expand Black women's political power across the state. The comprehensive candidate training will address the unique challenges Black women face on the campaign trail—including fundraising, public speaking, developing a campaign plan, and voter outreach—while equipping participants to be powerful communicators and effective policy advocates. The program will run from September 2025 to January 2026 and include a mix of co-led in-person training sessions and virtual workshops led by Emerge.

Interested participants are encouraged to apply for the program. Applications open Today, August 1, 2025, and must be submitted no later than August 25, 2025. Space is limited, and all participants will be selected through a brief application process. Applicants will be notified of their acceptance during the first week of September.

This is the first joint initiative between BWLC—a national organizing hub representing over 19 million Black women—and Emerge Action Fund, the 501(c)(4) affiliate of Emerge, which works to increase the number of women leaders through recruitment, training, and support. With over 50 Black women currently serving in elected office at the local, state, and federal levels in North Carolina, this training aims to build on that momentum and invest in the next generation of leaders.
