



## Building a High-Performance culture with aligned behaviour

### So, What *Is* High Performance?

### Why Behaviour matters now:

Performance culture isn't just about feel-good engagement. It:

- **Extends your runway** (less waste, better output)
- **Unlocks your Zone of Genius** (more time spent in high-value work)



- **Reduces risk and distraction** (less drama, more delivery)
- **Enables faster scale** (because chaos doesn't scale)

## How to Build It: Design, Align, Execute

### 1. Design: Codify behaviour in values that mean something

Values aren't posters on a wall. They're decision filters that:

- Embody your founder DNA.
- Define values as **actions**, not vague concepts.
- Guide decisions and feedback through them.
- Enable tough conversations using them as your anchor.

#### Example:

- Fluffy: "Go Big"
- Tangible: "Own the Outcome" or "Find a Better Way"

### 2. Align: One Standard for All

Your leaders *must* model the values. No exceptions.

- Lead from the front.
- Support leaders, but also hold them accountable.
- Be ready to have the hard conversations about fit, standards, and expectations.  
Accept that not everyone will be on the journey long-term—and that's okay.

### 3. Execute: Keep It Simple, Strategic & Human



- Link everything back to your business strategy.
- Launch with clarity and excitement: show what good looks like, what the team can expect, and how success is rewarded.
- Start small, don't overwhelm with processes.
- Acknowledge the shift: change is hard. Keep the door open for feedback and questions.
