




Why so many Americans are moving to Spain?

- Realistic timeline for visas, residence, housing, schooling, etc.


Importance of *professional*guidance and early coordination

Immigration ways? in Spain – work permits



Establishes residence rights for citizens of the European Union and their relatives.

EU REGIME (Royal Decree 240/2007)

> INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY ACT 14/2013

Applies for specific groups:
investors, highly skilled
professionals, researchers,
intracompany transferees,
digital nomads, and their
families.

Applies to all other groups not covered by the specific rules.

GENERAL IMMIGRATION ACT 4/2000



Main visa options for US citizens



- Digital Nomad Visa
- Non-Lucrative Visa
- Highly qualified professional Visa
- Intracompany transfer
- Startup visa
- Self-employed Visa
- Student visa and Internship Visa



The fine print that catches people off guard



- Background checks and live records expire in *90 days*.
- Translation and apostille delays some documents require a *federal apostille*
- Bank account opening difficulties –
 NIE?
- Misunderstanding "non-lucrative" restrictions
- Proof of income and health insurance for *initial residency* and renewals

Legal & Bureaucratic Differences



Legal *culture*

- Civil law vs. common law mindset
- Local vs. regional vs. national authorities (Ayuntamiento, Policía, etc.)
- Slow pace, especially around holidays

Daily bureaucracy

- Power of attorney use and notarial system
- Official translations & certified copies
- "Digital certificates" and electronic procedures

Buying or renting: what's different here?



Buying a *property*

- Property purchase process in Spain vs. U.S.
- Agents represent sellers, not buyers
- Due diligence before deposits
- Taxes (ITP/IVA)
- Ownership structure and contracts in Spanish

- Community expenses and repairs
- Ownership taxes:
 - ✓ "implied income"
 - ✓ municipality tax
 - ✓ Resident vs. non-resident
- Common mistake: buying a property without knowing well the area



Buying or renting: what's different here?




Renting a property

- Residencial rentals are heavily regulated
- "Tensed areas" popular cities
- Documents that you will be asked to provide intrusion into privacy or guarantees?
- Squatters and lengthy judicial procedures for eviction

- Types of leases:
 - ✓ Long-term residential
 - ✓ Mid-term "temporary"
 - ✓ Short-term tourist rentals



Tax and financial considerations



Taxes: where surprises really begin



The **Spanish tax** reality

- Worldwide income taxation for residents in Spain vs. Citizenshipbased taxation in the US
- US-Spain tax treaty and double taxation
- US-Spain Totalization Agreement (Social Security)

Common misunderstandings

- "Beckham Law" limitations
- Wealth tax & inheritance rules
- U.S. reporting obligations
 (IRS, FBAR, FATCA)



Integrating Tax, Banking, and Investments



- Align residency start with fiscal year
- Plan assets before tax residency:
 - ✓ When to withdraw pension plans
 - ✓ Sell US property
 - ✓ Minimizing wealth tax
- Investment portfolio:
 - ✓ PFIC taxation and capital gains
 - ✓ Custodians

- Currency exchange US and Spanish bank accounts
- Crucial:
 - ✓ Specialized financial advice
 - ✓ Coordinate with US CPA and Spanish tax lawyer

- Healthcare system expectations: public and private co-existence.

Plan early


- Documentation and timing are everything
