

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

### **Q1. Why should you choose to study in Finland?**

The education system in Finland claims to be some of the best in the world. If you have lived in Finland on a continuous residence permit (A permit) for an uninterrupted period of five years, you will be eligible for PR in Finland.

You do not necessarily have to take a test like IELTS or TOEFL.

### **Q6. How many hours can you work in Finland?**

In general, as an International student you can work up to 30 hours a week during term time and full time during holidays.

### **Q7. What is the Finland scholarship Policy?**

Some Finland Scholarship covers 100% tuition fee (awarded as a tuition fee waiver) and €5000 for relocation and other costs for the first year of studies. There are so many small scholarships available for students.

**Q8. How much you have to pay the rent in Finland?**

Single room in a shared flat typically costs between approximately €200 and €380 monthly.

**Q9. Can my spouse work while I study in Finland?**

Once the spouse's residence permit is approved, your family can join you in Finland. Your spouse can also work full-time in the country.
