# Accelerated Reader Millionaire Club






#### **Title: Silly Verse For Kids** Author: Spike Milligan Aimed for: All ages


**Title: The Hobbit** Author: J R R Tolkien

#### Title: Let's Build a House


Author: Mick Manning & Brita Granstrom Aimed for: KS1

## Library Summer Book Quest



Thank you to Mel from Libraries Unlimited for a wonderful whole school assembly. She introduced the children to **The Summer Book Quest**.

Thank you to everyone who signed up to the quest we had over 100 children register! The local libraries were very impressed and cannot wait to share a love of reading with you all. If you did not get chance to register for the summer Book Quest you can go to your local library and register for free.



#### How it works:

Children sign up at any local library including Torquay or Paignton and receive a starter pack. There is no defined number of books you need to read – they have made the quest inclusive and fun - they want everyone to enjoy reading and visiting the library.

There are three core elements to complete for the Summer Book Quest

1 - to visit the library as many times as possible

2 - to read stories that you love

3 - to complete one or more of the Summer Book Quest activities (see starter pack for details)

Stickers are collected for each element and can be stuck in the starter pack. Once a child has completed all three elements, they receive a final sticker, a quest certificate and a themed ninja starfish keyring.

There is an optional book review task to complete at the library to be entered into their prize draw.

We will hold our own prize draw at school for everyone who brings in their Book Quest certificate by the end of September. You could be in with the chance to win a book token.

It would be lovely to see as many children as possible from Preston Primary taking part in the summer reading challenge.


