

S	Body Parts	The different parts of our body, like our head, arms, legs, and hands, that help us move, feel, and do things every day.
	Senses	Our five senses are how our body helps us see, hear, smell, taste, and touch the world around us.
	Mammals	An animal group that is warm blooded, have fur or hair and give birth to live young.
	Birds	An animal group that is warm blooded and lay eggs. Body covered in feathers.
	Fish	An animal group that lives in water and has fins for swimming and gills for breathing.
2	Amphibians	An animal group that lives on land and water.
A S	Reptiles	An animal group cold blooded with skeleton inside body, dry scales, or hard skin.
	Insects	An animal group have bodies with 3 segments (parts), protected by hard shell
	Carniwore	Carnivores eat meat.
	Omnivore	Omnivores eat both meat and plants.
	Herbiwore	Herbivores eat plants.
