Curriculum Update

Woodland Camp

The children had lots of fun exploring the Woodland Camp again this week. We sat on the seating around the 'fire circle' and reminded ourselves of the safety rules. Throughout the year we will be cooking in the camp, and we will light a fire, so we are teaching the children to always walk around the fire circle seating and never walk across it so that we can stay safe at all times.

We had a wonderful time exploring and playing in the woods with our new friends! The children played lots of different games – they made dens, climbed trees, cooked in the mud kitchen, and used their imagination!









PE

This week the children enjoyed Mythical Creatures in PE. They enjoyed using beanbags and pretending to be dragons, fairies, and unicorns! They were practising jumping, throwing, catching, and passing hand to hand. The key objectives were:

Social: To be aware of others when working in a space.

Emotional: To be confident to try new challenges and keep trying if I find them difficult.

Thinking: To think about my learning and what I found challenging.

The children showed great responsibility for their learning. During a PE session the children are developing their relationships with one another, working creatively, following instructions, practising their listening and attention skills, exploring mathematical concepts, and keeping active. It is important to support the well-being of children, and we have identified that a great way to do this is through PE sessions.



Special Boxes

It has been wonderful to listen to many children sharing their special boxes in class. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning about their hobbies and interests, a great way for children to demonstrate how special and unique they are. We have been impressed by their confidence and enthusiasm to talk in front of new friends. It is a special moment when children find commonalities and realise they share interests; a great way of bringing everyone together.



Library

Reading is at the heart of our curriculum, and we aim to create a 'reading for pleasure' culture.

The children have enjoyed visiting our school library. They enjoyed looking at the different books and we started talking about the difference between fiction and non-fiction.

Visiting the library is a chance for the children to independently choose a book to share at home with you. <u>We are not expecting the children to read these books themselves, they are to share with a grown up for pleasure</u>.

We plan to visit the library **every Monday** so please ensure they bring their book in their book bag every Monday. If for some reason we are unable to visit on a Monday, we will let you know at the earliest convenience.

Please encourage your child to look after their library book. Can we ask that water bottles are not carried in children's book bags as sometimes they leak. Thank you.







Child Led Tour of the classrooms

Phonics – Read Write Inc



This week we learnt the sounds 'k', 'u', 'g', 'b' and 'f'. There is a short video on Seesaw for children to watch and join in. The video helps children to recall sounds speedily. This will help children to move to the next stage of reading – blending sounds to read words.

If your child is struggling with particular sounds, we have assigned further video links on Seesaw for them to practice. The practice videos are a little longer (8 minutes). We know some people are struggling to open the links. We recommend you try using different devices or paste the link into a web browser. If problems persist, please come and talk to a class teacher.

Maggie Muncher has been busy in the classroom this week. She has been helping the children to oral blend (hearing sounds and blending them together to say the word). We have assigned another video from Maggie on Seesaw. Have fun!

Maths

Over the past few weeks, we have been exploring the wonderful world of repeating patterns. The children began by exploring simple AB patterns - for example red, blue, red, blue - using a variety of materials such as cubes, beads, and counters.



Once they were confident, we moved on to more complex ABC patterns (blue, red, yellow, blue, red, yellow), adding an extra challenge and encouraging careful observation and prediction.



It is tricky for children to spot the unit of repeat and continue a pattern. We have been impressed with their determination and resilience to learn how to spot and create repeated patterns. Well done everyone. We have set a pattern challenge on Seesaw this week. You might like to help your child make a simple repeating pattern at home and send us a picture on Seesaw. This could be made with anything; leaf, stick, leaf, stick or cup, fork, cup, fork.







Learning Ladder

We recently introduced the 'Learning Ladder' to the children. In Foundation Stage, we use this as a visual aid to promote and reward children who have been challenging their learning. Children might get 1 'jump' up the ladder for applying what they have been taught in lessons and demonstrating their knowledge, for example, we might have taught them how to use a ruler to measure in a Maths lesson, and then during 'Choosing Learning Time' we see them using the ruler to measure in the builder's construction area. They will also receive a jump for things like being a good role model, showing resilience when faced with challenges or great teamwork.

When they reach the top of the ladder, they can have a 'dip in the box', where they get to choose a small prize to keep.

Room on the Broom

The children have enjoyed reading the story 'Room on the Broom' by author Julia Donaldson. We have read the story many times so the children are familiar with the text and can join in with the familiar phrases. They have been using some of the vocabulary from the book and enjoyed taking part in some drama. We introduced four words:

Searched – 'I searched for my other shoe, but I could not find it'.

Grinned – 'Freddie grinned when he saw his pudding at lunchtime'.

Magnificent – 'Your writing is magnificent'.

Politely – 'Harry politely held the door open for Mrs Oliver'.

Please try and use these words at home in different contexts with the children.
