Love to Learn Be a Good Citizen Ready for Work



Curriculum - Geography - Understanding the World



Place – an area or space

Compare – to look at similarities and differences

Natural – occurred from nature

We asked Why and Where questions, 'Why do we not have grass inside the classroom?' and 'Where would you find a door?'

The children took photos of their observations in the Classroom and Woodland Camp. They then made close comparisons and sorted their photographs and talked about what makes a place the way it is.

In PE the children enjoyed using different travelling actions to make their way to the castle. They had to follow the path whilst travelling in different directions moving safely into a space. They had to freeze when the ogre was coming! The key objectives were:

- To keep a gap between you and the person in front of you.
- Look in the direction you are moving

At the end of the session, we created a path to the castle using equipment. The children had to travel along the path jumping, crawling, sliding, running, and balancing. Thankfully they all made it to the castle safely!







Phonics – Read Write Inc



Thank you for your support at the phonic information session. It is always a pleasure to invite parents and carers into school and to share our love of reading.

Here are some of the key points for how you can help at home:

- The importance of using pure sounds and not putting uh at the end of the sound use this link to see a demonstration: https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/reading-owl/find-a-book/read-write-inc-phonics--1/phonics-pure-sounds-video). Not using the letter names.
- Promoting the correct letter formation, using the Read Write Inc phrases. Each child has a Set 1 sounds handwriting booklet to use at home.
- Engage in the phonic activities on Seesaw
- Play I spy games using the letter sounds not names
- Keeping children active to promote gross and fine motor skills.

Child Led Tour of the Learning Environment

To support our School Aims of Love to Learn and Ready for Work, this week, the children in Foundation were tour guides! The parents, carers, and extended family members came into the classroom, and the children gave them a personalised tour of the learning environment. The children prepared a tour guide tick sheet, some key vocabulary, and STEM sentences to use.

The tour enabled the children to practise their Oracy skills, particularly presentational talk - the ability to speak clearly, confidently, and with purpose to an audience. Speaking to familiar adults is a great starting point for developing these skills, helping children to build confidence in expressing their ideas and sharing their learning. It was a joy to see them take pride in explaining their routines, learning areas, and favourite activities.

The children have only been in school for five weeks but are already showing great responsibility for their learning environment. It was wonderful to hear the children talk so positively and feel proud to be part of the Preston family. Well done Puffins and Penguins!








Parent Teacher Meetings – Monday 13th and Tuesday 14th October

Maths

We had lots of fun in Maths this week! We were introduced to the concept of 'whole' and 'part'.


We discussed how the size of the object did not matter – it was the fact that whole meant 'complete' or 'all of it'.

We talked about how a 'whole' object could be split into two or more parts. We further applied this idea through fruit at our snack time, e.g. "This is a whole apple." "I have eaten part of my apple. I have a part left." "Would you like a whole pear or a part of a pear?"

It was important that children did not use the language of half 'I have half a carrot' as this was not mathematically correct. To have half, the two parts need to be equal.

The children worked in pairs to decide if they had a **whole** or **part** of a carrot.

We will be using this 'whole and part' knowledge in the future to split quantities of objects into parts for example 3 objects can be split into 1 and 2 (1 is a part and 2 is a part, 3 is the whole).

JIGSAW - Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education



PSHE Education (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) is a planned programme of learning through which children and young people acquire the knowledge, understanding, and skills they need to successfully manage their lives — now and in the future. Jigsaw is a whole-school approach and embodies a positive philosophy and creative teaching and learning activities to nurture children's development as compassionate and well-rounded human beings as well as building their capacity to learn.

Jigsaw combines PSHE, emotional literacy, mindfulness, social skills, and spiritual development. Jigsaw aims to help children know and value who they really are and how they relate to other people in this ever-changing world. There are six puzzles/themes (one per half term) and every year group studies the same puzzle at the same time (sequentially ordered from September to July). They are: Being Me in My World, Celebrating Difference, Dreams and Goals, Healthy Me, Relationships, Changing Me.













Every Jigsaw session starts with 'Calm Me' time where children are encouraged to relax and control their breathing. We then sing a song about togetherness. This week's discussion topic was 'I can tell you why my home is special to me'. The children talked about the special people in their lives and drew a picture of their family.

We will share a Knowledge Organiser for our first half term of Jigsaw 'Being Me in My World'. This will detail key vocabulary and activities to enable you to continue the learning at home.
