We cannot believe that we have already reached the end of the first half-term in Foundation Stage! The children have settled so well into school life learning new routines and becoming familiar with their new environment. Thank you to all of the parents and carers for your support in your child's learning and for making your child's start in school so successful.

Curriculum – Science – Understanding the World

Our curriculum helps children to explore and understand the world around them. We have recently been learning about our five senses: taste, touch, smell, sight, and hearing. The children have enjoyed a variety of activities exploring their senses. Some of their favourite activities were tasting lemon, guessing the hidden objects from the sound they make, smelling different objects hiding in a box, and reaching into a feely bag to

explore different textures.

<u>Literacy – The Little Red Hen</u>

At Preston Primary we foster a love of reading. We have been re-telling the story of 'The Little Red Hen' – the children have loved joining in with the actions and the repeated phrases. The children have used their knowledge of the phonic sounds to start writing key words from the story, e.g. hen, cat, red, dog. The 'Little Red Hen' also inspired the children to bake their own 'bread'. However, unlike the lazy dog, sleepy cat, and noisy duck, they helped one another to make the bread.

We used the vocabulary: dough, knead, rise, roll, and mix. We learnt that yeast is the special ingredient which helps the bread to rise. The children enjoyed using the timers to measure how long we had to wait for the dough to rise. We hope you enjoyed sharing your bread at home.







PE

In PE the children have enjoyed working cooperatively with a partner taking turns and sharing equipment. They enjoyed rolling and bouncing the balls. These are some of the main objectives:

Social – To talk with a partner to decide which hoops to score in.

Emotional – To try hard to beat my score

Thinking – To choose my own way to travel and to understand how to score.

Puffins and Penguins look forward to PE lessons each week. The children always demonstrate good listening and follow instructions. Well done everyone.








<u>School Value - Respect</u>

The long term legacy of Preston Primary School will be the personal values that our pupils take to Secondary School and beyond. Passing exams is important in life but needs to be complimented by a set of personal values that enable one to flourish in the workplace, in the community and in the family. At Preston, we have six values - one for each half term within the year.

This half-term we focused on the value of **Respect**. This links in well with being in a new class and ascertaining class rules. In Foundation Stage, we learn our school values in dinosaur form! Each dinosaur has a special name, and we talk about how we can demonstrate that particular value in our learning and everyday life.

Celebrations and Festivals – Diwali

After half term we will be learning about different festivals and celebrations. This gives children a respect and understanding of different cultures and traditions. However, this week it was Diwali, so we started our celebrations.

The word Diwali means 'rows of lighted lamps'. It is celebrated by Hindu people across the world. Diwali is also celebrated in Sikhism and Jainism.

Diwali is known as the 'festival of lights' because houses, shops, and public places are decorated with small lamps called 'diyas'. We used salt dough to make our own diya pots and painted them in bright colours. We also decorated the classroom with lights and other decorations.

Rangoli is a popular Diwali tradition. Beautiful patterns are made using bright colours. People draw Rangoli on the floor by the entrance of their homes to welcome the gods and bring good luck. We created our own Rangoli patterns using chalk.








Parent meetings
