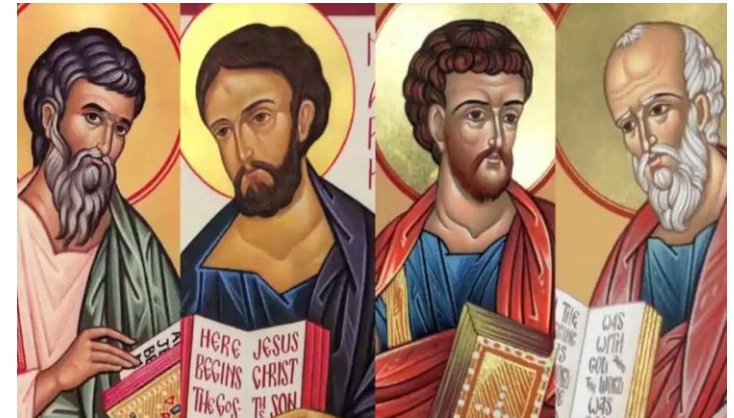
The Powerful Knowledge we will take away from this Learning Enquiry (what children will be learning):

Making sense of beliefs



Identify texts that come from the Gospels of Matthew 4 18-22, Mark 1 40-44 and Luke 10 25-37, which tells the story of the life and teachings of Jesus.

Clear links will be made between the calling of the first disciples and how Christians today try to follow Jesus and be 'fishers of people'.



Understanding the impact



Understand and consider how every day, Christians try to show love for all, including how Christian leaders try to follow Jesus' teaching in different ways. Through the Gospels, Jesus' actions towards people considered to be 'outcasts' will be examined, and what this means for Christians today and how they try to lead their lives in accordance with the teachings of Jesus.










The four gospels we will learn about were written by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

Making connections



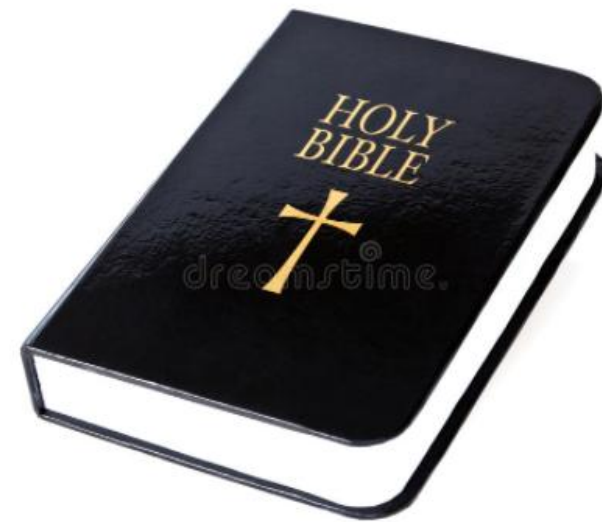
Connecting

Links will be made between the importance of love in the Bible stories studied and life in the world today, with the children giving reasons for their ideas and opinions. Children will visit our local church and find out how local Christians try to have a positive impact on our community.

Key Vocabulary		
Christian		A person who is a believer of Christianity.
The Bible		The Holy Book of Christianity comprising the Old and New Testaments.
Jesus		The name of the man who Christians believe was the son of God, and whose teachings are the basis of Christianity.
Gospel		The record of Christ's life and teaching in the first four books of the New Testament. It means 'Good News'.
Disciple		A personal follower of Christ during his life, especially one of the twelve Apostles.
Message		A moral point that is being shared with others. The gospel spreads Jesus' message.
Follower		A person who supports and admires a particular person or set of ideas.
Teachings		Ideas taught by Jesus based on how a person should behave according to Christian values.
Worship		The act of showing reverence to a deity.
