	Europe	Europe is a continent , which means a big area of land. It has many countries, like France, Spain, and the UK. Scandinavia is part of Europe too!
	Human features	Human features are things people have built or made , like houses, roads, bridges, and cities.
	Physical features	Physical features are natural things on Earth, like mountains, rivers, lakes, and forests.
	Capital city	A capital city is the main city of a country where the government works. For example, London is the capital of the UK.
	Weather	Weather is what the sky and air are like today .
	Climate	Climate is what the weather is usually like over a long time in a place.
