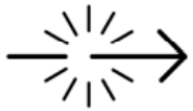
For Christians what is the impact of Pentecost?

Making sense
of beliefs



We will discuss, then make clear links between the story of Pentecost and Christian beliefs about the 'Kingdom of God' on Earth and offer informed suggestions about what the events of Pentecost in Acts 2 might mean. We will give examples of what Pentecost means to some Christians now.



Simple links will be investigated between the description of Pentecost in Acts 2, the Holy Spirit, the kingdom of God, and how Christians live now. We will describe how Christians show their beliefs about the Holy Spirit in worship.



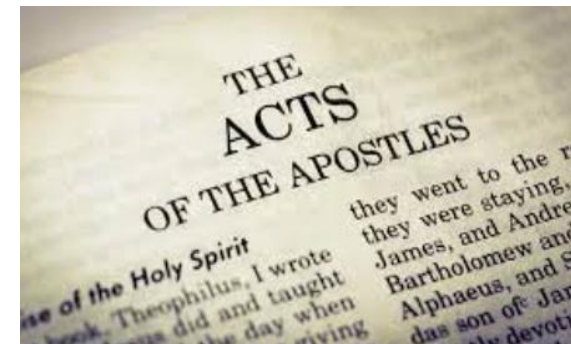
Connecting
