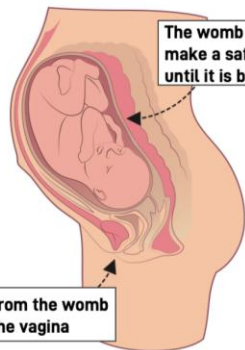

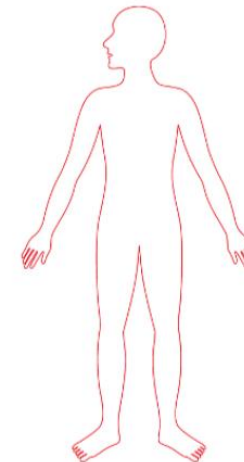



 <p>Puberty</p>	<p>Puberty</p>	<p>Puberty is about getting boys' and girls' bodies ready for making and having babies when they are grown up.</p>
	<p>Vagina, Uterus (womb) and ovaries.</p>	<p>The passage that leads from the womb to the outside is called the vagina. The uterus (womb) grows and gets ready to make a safe space for a baby to grow until it is big enough to be born. The ovaries store hundred of tiny eggs and during puberty they start to release them, one at a time each month.</p>
	<p>Penis, Sperm and Testicles</p>	<p>The testicles grow and start to make sperm which are tiny seeds that are needed to start a baby growing. Sperm can be released through the penis.</p>
	<p>Stereotypes</p>	<p>A stereotype is a pre-judgment you might make about someone before you get to know them. It is often based on gender, age, race or group membership.</p>

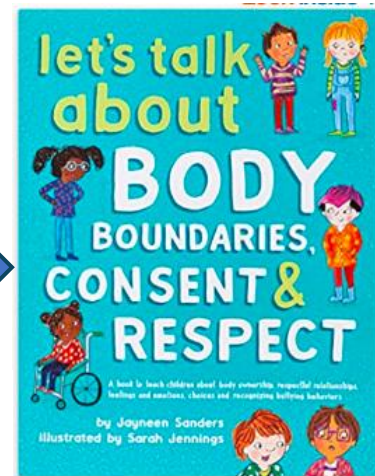
