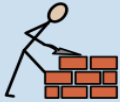

	Human Geography	Where people are and what they have made.
	Physical Geography	The natural world, such as mountains, rivers or oceans
	County	An area of land in the UK, much smaller than a country, and includes towns and cities.
	Town	A place where people live and work, usually smaller than a city and bigger than a village.
	Village	A place where people live and work, usually smaller than a town.
	Mountain	A mountain is very high land that raises above the land around it.
	Moors	A moor is open, wild land with low plants and few trees
	Landmark	A landmark is a well-known place that helps people recognise an area
	Population	The number of people living in a place.
