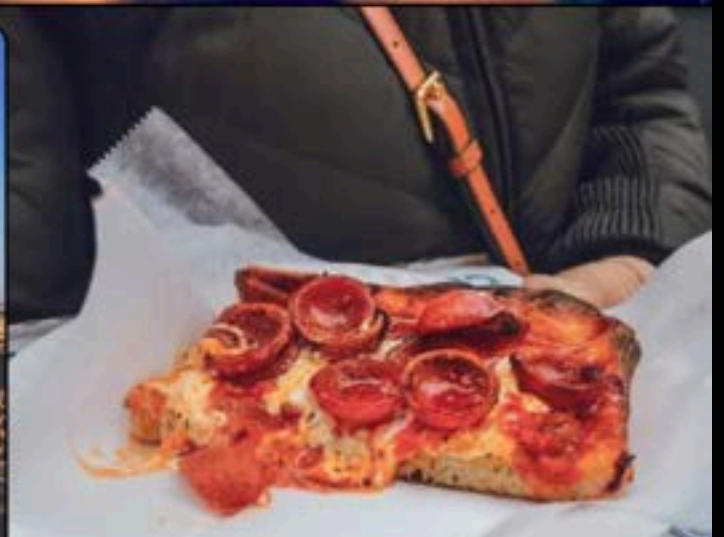
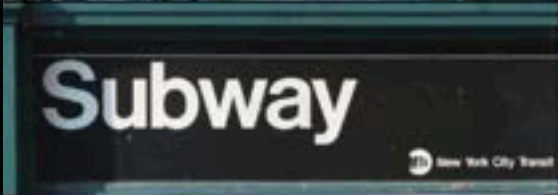
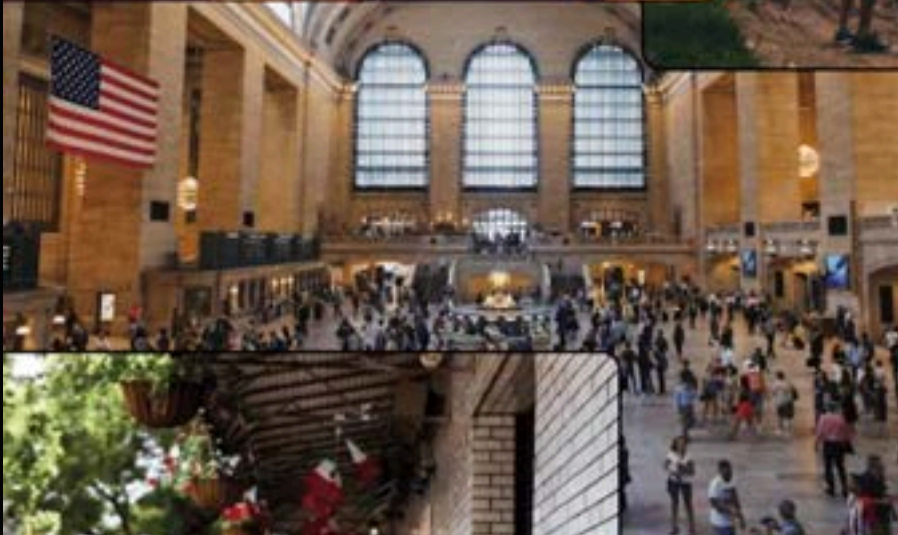

KNOW YOUR TRAIN

Local and Express trains run on the same line, designated by color. Don't refer to trains by color or you may end up on the wrong one.

UPTOWN OR DOWNTOWN

Most trains in Manhattan run Uptown toward the Bronx or Downtown toward Brooklyn. Pay attention to direction.

03



HOW TO PAY

Tap and pay with a contactless bank card, or buy an OMNY card for \$1. You only pay to enter — not to leave.

MORE TIPS

Scan the QR code for first-time-rider tips, station maps, and live service alerts.

VISITING FROM ABROAD?

INTERNATIONAL TRAVELERS.



SIM CARDS

Pick up a prepaid SIM at the airport or at **T-Mobile, AT&T or Verizon** stores throughout the city. Plans start around **\$30–40** for unlimited data for a week. Alternatively, buy an eSIM online before you travel — often cheaper.



CASH VS CARD

Most places accept **contactless payments** — Apple Pay and Google Pay work everywhere on the subway. Keep some **small bills (\$20–40)** for bodegas, food trucks, tips, and the occasional cash-only spot. ATMs are widely available.



VISAS

Citizens of **42 countries** can enter visa-free under the Visa Waiver Program (ESTA). All others must apply for a US visa in advance. Check **travel.state.gov** for your country's requirements well before you travel.



POWER & PLUGS

The US uses a different plug type and voltage. Check your devices before you travel.

Type A · 120V · 60Hz

Two flat parallel pins.

Most modern electronics (phones, laptops) work on any voltage — check the label.



EMERGENCY

Dial 911 for Police, fire & ambulance. Dial 311 for non-urgent city assistance.

Prices shown in NYC don't include tax — it's added at checkout.

NYC sales tax is **8.875%** — always budget extra.
Clothes and shoes under \$110 are exempt.

Tipping is standard in the US — not optional.

Restaurants 18–20%, taxis 10–15%, hotel housekeeping \$2–5/night.



DRINKING & SMOKING

The legal drinking age is **21** — bring photo ID even if you look older. Smoking is banned in restaurants, bars, parks, beaches, and within 15 ft of building entrances. Vaping follows the same rules. Cannabis is legal for adults 21+ but cannot be consumed in public spaces.

BEFORE YOU GO

GOOD THINGS TO KNOW...

Little things that make the trip smoother. Skim before you fly out — you'll thank yourself.



TAXIS

Yellow taxis are available when the roof numbers are lit up.



SUBWAY

\$3.00 per ride. Tap your contactless card or phone at the turnstile — no MetroCard needed.



WIFI

The free "LinkNYC" network blankets most of the city. Look for the silver kiosks.



SHOES

Bring sneakers or comfy shoes. New York is made for walking.



TAXES & TIPPING

Restaurants 15–20%. Taxis 10–15%. Bartenders \$1–2 per drink.
