

### Parish Life

Parish pilgrimage - update: we have now been informed that, due to insufficient interest, the Mon 22th -Thurs 24 September Oratory Parish Pilgrimage to Walsingham has been cancelled. We are planning to contact All Saints next week to book the spaces for the day pilgrimage to Buckfast for those who have signed up - so if you are thinking of going, please put your name down this weekend.

All Saints Parish Pilgrimage to Buckfast Abbey in Devon: On Saturday 27th September a pilgrimage will be held to help parishioners gain a Jubilee indulgence. The cost per person is £26.50 for the day, including coach travel, entrance to the exhibition and the cream tea. A £15 deposit per person needs to be paid by 2 August to the St. Mary's parish office with your contact details we leave St. Mary's at 9am.

Our Lady of Penrhys: The annual pilgrimage to Our Lady's shrine will take place on Sunday 17th August. Mass will be celebrated at 3pm (weather permitting) at the foot of the statue. Please bring your own seat. All are welcome!

August: Since the 16th century, Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not 'adored', as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. The 2025 National Jubilee Walking Pilgrimage of Hope: is a national walking pilgrimage for England & Wales with four main Ways converging at the Cathedral of St Barnabas, Nottingham, on Saturday 13th September 2025, the eve of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. It is an initiative of the Hearts in Search of God project.

The Ways start at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich and London and will bless our nations with a Sign of the Cross. The routes use established hiking routes and are off road as much as possible. A small group of 'perpetual pilgrims' will walk the full distance of each Way, with up to 20 day pilgrims joining for day stages.
