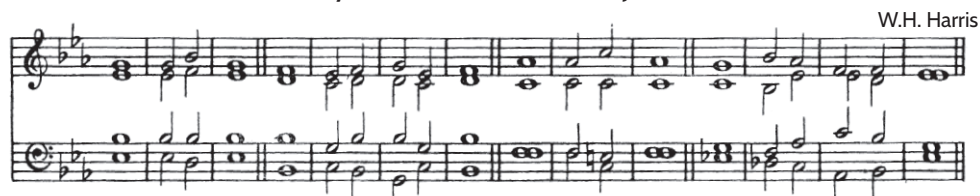

All Saints Parish Pilgrimage to Buckfast Abbey in Devon: On Saturday 27th September a pilgrimage will be held to help parishioners gain a Jubilee indulgence. The cost per person is £26.50 for the day, including coach travel, entrance to the exhibition and the cream tea. A £15 deposit per person needs to be paid by 2 August to the St. Mary's parish office with your contact details we leave St. Mary's at 9am.

Hymn Singing: As St Augustine said, "*He who sings prays twice.*" A big part of our Ordinariate patrimony is congregational hymn singing. Without an organist this can be difficult, but there is now help... We have just received a number of melody edition hymnals. These are a little bigger than the 'words only' edition and there will be a number of these available at the back from next Sunday. Please feel free to use them to help you sing along.

August: Since the 16th century, Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not 'adored', as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Food parcels: As you all know, we have been supporting a number of families with food donations. We are now receiving support from a local supermarket through the Olio scheme. This scheme encourages the redistribution of fresh fruit, vegetables and bakery goods that are close to their best before date; with the aim of reducing food waste. 2 local volunteers have begun to pass such items on to us. They have asked that we make use of the items, to supplement food parcels; for use in the warm hub, or any other community activities and to encourage parishioners and the wider community to make use of these free donations.

We are being supplied with more than we need currently, so I will be placing a basket at the back of church, containing surplus items; please help yourself. There is no cost involved, we simply don't want to throw anything away.

The 2025 National Jubilee Walking Pilgrimage of Hope: is a national walking pilgrimage for England & Wales with four main Ways converging at the Cathedral of St Barnabas, Nottingham, on Saturday 13th September 2025, the eve of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. It is an initiative of the Hearts in Search of God project.

The Ways start at the Catholic cathedrals in Cardiff, Leeds, Norwich and London and will bless our nations with a Sign of the Cross. The routes use established hiking routes and are off road as much as possible. A small group of 'perpetual pilgrims' will walk the full distance of each Way, with up to 20 day pilgrims joining for day stages.
