#### Parish Life

Clergy Relief Fund: A second Collection for the Ordinariate 'Clergy Relief Fund' will be taken at all Masse on the weekend 20/21 September - as is customary, parishes entrusted to the Ordinariate take up these collections for the Ordinariate funds (rather than the Diocesan ones). The clergy relief fund exists to support the clergy of the Ordinariate and their dependents in ill-health or retirement. Many thanks for your help with this!

Warm hub: We have applied again to serve as a local 'warm hub' this winter - this won't start until October/November, but now is the time to get organised, and we will contact existing volunteers to arrange a meeting. Craft club: if you enjoy crafting whether it be knitting, card making, model building, etc., read on... we are hoping to start a group for people to get together maybe once a week (bringing along their own projects) for a 'craft and chat' session in the side room.
