Livestreamed Evensong Sunday to Thursday

Evening Prayer is prayed publicly in church Sunday to Thursday at 5.30pm, using Divine Worship Daily Office. You can join either in person or via the livestream. If you don't have a copy of the Office book, you can get the entire office of the day at **singtheoffice.com**

Thursday evening Mass

Mass at 7.30pm on Thursdays is celebrated according to Divine Worship. Mass is preceded at 5.30pm by Evening Prayer and an hour of Eucharistic Adoration, with Confession available.

Monthly Solemn Evensong & Benediction

One Wednesday per month we have a service of Solemn Evensong and Benediction. The next is at 7pm on **Wednesday 17**th **November**, followed by a Bring and Share.

This office of Evening Prayer, or 'Evensong', consists of psalms, readings, canticles from scripture, with hymns and prayers. It gives expression to and preserves for Catholic worship the worthy Anglican liturgical patrimony, understood as that which has nourished the Catholic faith throughout the history of the Anglican tradition and prompted aspirations towards ecclesial unity. This beautiful service is an opportunity to share our distinctive liturgy with others. ¹

Jubilee Pilgrimage to Rome

With just one blister I successfully reached Rome with 11 other walking pilgrims, including Jim Quigley from Coventry, on Wednesday 8th October, having set off from Siena on Sunday 28th September to walk just a 150 mile section of the ancient Via Francigena from Canterbury to Rome. It was such an amazing experience – walking through beautiful Tuscan scenery, sharing the journey and getting to know very well one's fellow-pilgrims, meeting some beautiful people along way, celebrating Mass each day in a chapel or church, entering into Rome, meeting up with pilgrims who had flown out to Rome, including Bishop David, approaching St. Peter's Basilica and entering through the Holy Door, singing Evensong at the Venerable English College, saying prayers at the tomb of Benedict XVI, celebrating Mass in Newman's titular cardinatial church, San Giorgio in Velabro, on his Feast Day and in the catacombs of St Callistus the following day. Evening Prayer is recited publicly in church Sunday to Thursday at 5.30pm and is livestreamed (see the parish website). Please join in.

If you intend to pray daily Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer, the table below gives you the page numbers for each of the parts of the Office for each day this week. Placing the markers in the correct pages, as indicated in the table below, takes a few minutes each time, but once done, actually praying the Office is quite straight-forward.

The Order of Morning Prayer (MP) (Matins) begins on page 375

The Order of Evening Prayer (EP) (Evensong) begins on page 421

All numbers below refer to page numbers in Divine Worship: Daily Office (DWDO), unless otherwise indicated.

Note: the Office hymn is always optional, but encouraged.
