THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

Wednesday 23rd September Solemn Evensong & Benediction (Eve of the Solemnity)
Thursday 24th September 7.30pm SOLEMN MASS

One Wednesday per month we have a service of Solemn Evensong and Benediction. The next is at 7pm on Wednesday 23rd September 2026 , followed by a Bring and Share in the parish room.

This office of Evening Prayer, or ‘Evensong’, consists of psalms, readings, canticles from scripture, with hymns and prayers. It gives expression to and preserves for Catholic worship the worthy Anglican liturgical patrimony, understood as that which has nourished the Catholic faith throughout the history of the Anglican tradition and prompted aspirations towards ecclesial unity. This beautiful service is an opportunity to share our distinctive liturgy with others.¹

Ordinariate Festival 2026



The theme of this year’s Festival, *Beauty, Truth, and Goodness*, helps to emphasise aspects of the Ordinariate’s unique gifts which the Bishops of the three Ordinariates and the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith identified in a recently published document; and in particular, one of the document’s themes, “Evangelisation through Beauty...not as an end in itself, but insofar as it has the power to lead us to God” will be explored at the Festival this year.

The Festival falls into two parts: First, the talks, Mass, Mattins and Evensong which will be open to all and to which all are welcome! The second part — fellowship over shared meals and discussions with Bishop David — is limited in capacity and so restricted to Ordinariate members, associate members and those who have made their spiritual home within an Ordinariate group. To access this second part requires booking via this website. Numbers are limited because of space and catering purposes so early booking is advised.

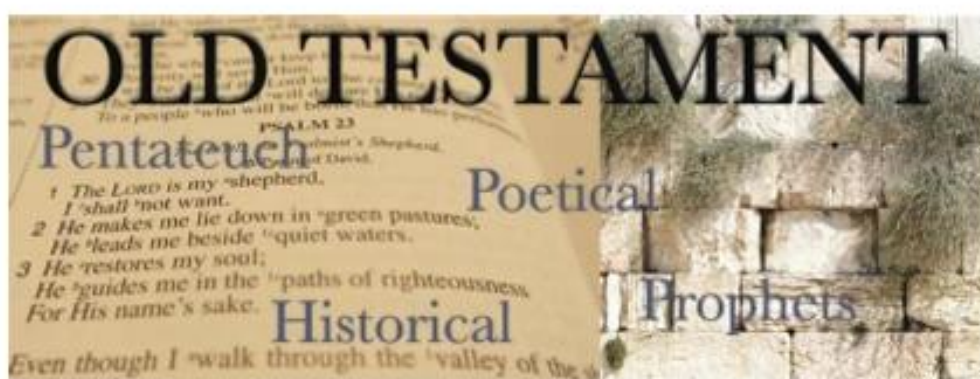

Looking Backwards - Looking Forward



A six week course on the meaning of the narratives of the Old Testament.

It will be held online, to allow as many people as possible to attend, and to prevent people travelling at night. All the dates below are **Thursday evenings**, and will begin at **7.30pm**. The GMeet links are below, and will be published weekly by email, and on our Facebook page.

The aim is to give laity a broad overview of the Old Testament narratives; how they fit together; what kind of language they contain; and how they look towards what we now call the New Testament. A downloadable handout will be produced for each session, on the day.

Evening Prayer is recited publicly in church Sunday to Thursday at 5.30pm and is livestreamed (see the parish website). **Please join in.**

If you intend to pray daily **Morning Prayer** and **Evening Prayer**, the table below gives you the page numbers for each of the parts of the Office for each day this week. Placing the markers in the correct pages, as indicated in the table below, takes a few minutes each time, but once done, actually praying the Office is quite straight-forward.

The Order of Morning Prayer (MP) (Matins) begins on page 375

The Order of Evening Prayer (EP) (Evensong) begins on page 421

All numbers below refer to *page numbers* in Divine Worship: Daily Office (DWDO), unless otherwise indicated.

Note: the Office hymn is always optional, but encouraged.
