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Laurier cascade border crossing

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The Laurier-Cascade Border Crossing connects Kettle Falls, Washington with Christina Lake, British Columbia, spanning the Canada-US border. US Route 395 merges with British Columbia Highway 395. The town was established in 1895 as a base for prospecting and railway expansion. In 1897, mining drew numerous prospectors, prompting the opening of a customs office. The rail head arrived in 1899, and the customs office came under Port of Grand Forks' administration. The Great Northern Railway laid track northward, with Canada Customs applying seals to freight cars entering at Carson and Cascade. In 1932, new facilities were erected, and in 1948, the site was purchased from the Cascade Development Company. The status was upgraded to the Port of Cascade City in 1948. Traveling through Washington State requires planning, especially when crossing borders into Canada. The official website provides up-to-date information on border crossings, including travel tips and real-time traffic conditions. When reviewing the list of border crossings from west to east, you can choose one with relatively shorter wait times. Some popular ports include Lynden / Aldergrove, Sumas / Huntingdon, Blaine / Surrey Pacific Highway (Truck Crossing), and Oroville / Osoyoos. However, commercial vehicles are not allowed to use the Peace Arch port due to congestion. To stay informed about border crossing traffic, you can: * Check the official website for detailed information on each port * Use traffic apps or websites like 511 Washington, which provides up-to-date traffic conditions and customized updates over the phone * Plan your trip around peak months (August, July, September) and peak days (weekends and holidays) * Be aware of events that may affect border crossings, such as the Northwest Washington Fair in late August A business located in Christina Lake, BC V0H 1E0 is open daily from 8am to midnight for travelers. For commercial purposes, the business operates Monday through Friday from 8am to 5pm, while it remains closed on both Saturdays and Sundays. The hours of operation were last updated on November 8th, 2024.
