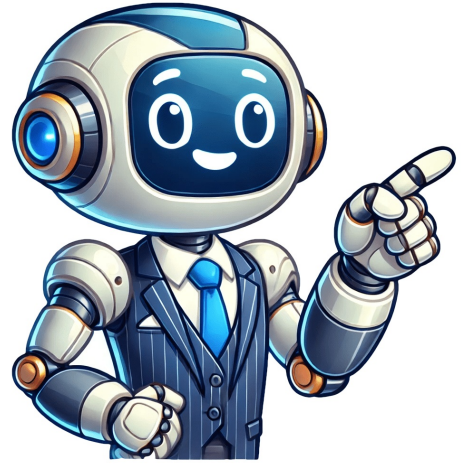


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The Kenya Institute of Management (KIM) is a reputable institution in Kenya and across East Africa renowned for producing high-quality graduates equipped with practical management and leadership skills. The college's courses are accredited by the Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) authority and validated by the Kenya National Qualifications Authority (KNQA). With over 65 years of experience, KIM has established a network of 19 branches across the country. The institute offers various academic programs, including short professional certification courses lasting around 3 months, certificate programs taking 6 months to complete, and diploma courses spanning up to 24 months. The list of diploma courses includes Business Management, Human Resource Management, Purchasing & Supplies, Office Management, Sales & Marketing, Archives & Records Management, and Project Management. The fee structure for KIM's diploma courses is as follows: Diploma in Business Management costs Ksh. 110,000, while the modules' fees range from Ksh. 3,000 to Ksh. 10,000. The institute also offers certificate courses at various levels, including Certificate Level 4 and Certificate Level 5, which require specific qualifications and have varying fee structures. KIM's professional certification courses are designed for short-term completion (2.5-3 months) and cover topics such as Supervisory Skills Development, Strategic Management & Leadership, Entrepreneurship, Monitoring & Evaluation, Automation of Records and Info. Systems, Environmental Impact Assessment, and Quality Management. Kenya Institute of Management (KIM) offers various training programs, including Travel Management, ICDL certification, E-Learning courses, CPA, and ATC Courses. For instance, the Travel Management program takes 12 months to complete at a cost of Ksh. 30,000. On the other hand, the ICDL certification course requires 6 months to finish with a fee of Ksh. 37,500. Moreover, KIM provides online E-Learning courses on its platform. Furthermore, the institution has partnered with KASNEB to offer CPA and ATC Courses. The Accounting Technicians Certificate, ATC, demands at least a D+ in KCSE or a KASNEB technician qualification. To register for the Certified Public Accountants (CPA), one must have at least a C+ in KCSE and both Mathematics and English or a KACE with 2 principal passes. We shall outline the management fee structure of the seven diploma courses provided by our institution. There are two methods to apply: one is to pick up an application form or download it online from the college website, fill it out, and return it to the institution's register office. The other method is to apply online by following these steps: 1. Complete the online application form on their website (. 2. Submit copies of your previous academic documents. 3. Attach a copy of your identification document (National ID, Passport, or Birth Certificate). 4. Pay the non-refundable application fee and submit it. For all professional programs offered in the institution, kindly inquire about requirements for the particular program you're interested in attending. Kenya Institute of Management (KIM) requires applicants to validate their academic certificates and transcripts from the Kenya National Examinations Council (KNEC) before submitting their applications. The institute has multiple locations across the country, including Nairobi, Mombasa, Eldoret, Kisumu, Machakos, Nakuru, Thika, Embu, Kisii, Kitengela, Nanyuki, Narok, and Nyeri, each with its own contact information. The course offered by KIM is designed to equip students with knowledge and skills in project planning and management. The target group for this course includes learners from all disciplines who manage or are about to manage big or small projects as part of their work. The course content covers principles of project management, elements of management in projects, project leadership and governance, and environmental impact assessment and analysis. The intake for the course is currently ongoing, with a duration of 4 months and certification from the KIPM Examination Board. It's essential to note that the fee structure may be subject to change, so it's crucial to confirm with the institution before making any transaction. Due to high demand and competition for spots, students will be admitted on a first-come-first-served basis. Only applicants who meet the requirements will be considered. Our training programs involve a range of activities such as lectures, discussions, journal clubs, practical projects, and research initiatives. Sessions are available on Saturdays from 8:30 am to 11:00 am or 11:30 am to 2:00 pm. We also offer distance learning and e-learning options with monthly Saturday meetings for the former and online consultation and examination for the latter. Regardless of the study mode, students will be assigned a tutor who has expertise in project management (PM) to guide them throughout their assignments. The exam policy emphasizes peer review, where mentors evaluate assignments and provide constructive feedback, facilitating high-quality work and timely completion. To qualify, applicants must have achieved at least a D+ grade in their Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education and demonstrate proficiency in computer applications. Only qualified candidates will be allowed to proceed with tuition payments. Our fees structure varies by study mode: - Distance Learning: Ksh 52,000 (Application fee: Ksh 2,000, Tuition fee: Ksh 40,000, Examination fee: Ksh 10,000) - E-Learning: Same as distance learning - On-campus Part-Time Saturday Mode: Ksh 57,000 (Application fee: Ksh 2,000, Tuition fee: Ksh 45,000, Examination fee: Ksh 10,000) Payment can be made in full, two installments, or via a banker's cheque/cash deposit. Non-East African students must pay an additional 25% on all charges. The application process involves submitting the form with relevant documents (academic certificates, passport-sized photographs, and identification).
