The SRD Grant program in South Africa is designed to give monthly financial help to people who are jobless or don't earn much, between 18 and 60 years old, with no other social support. If your application was rejected but you think it was unfair, you can appeal the decision to the Ministry of Social Development within 90 days. The appeal process is done by the Independent Tribunal for Social Assistance Appeals (ITSAA) and takes around 60-90 days. If they agree with you, they will reverse SASSA's decision and you'll start getting the R350 grant. You'll be told if your appeal gets rejected. Before appealing, make sure you understand the eligibility criteria: you must be a South African citizen or resident, live in SA, be between 18-60 years old, not get UIF payments, provide accurate info like ID card and bank details, have no other source of income, and earn less than R624/month. If your app was rejected but you meet all these criteria, you can appeal. First, check the SASSA Portal to make sure your info is up to date: log in with your 13-digit ID number and update any incorrect or outdated info before appealing. Any errors could lead to your appeal getting denied. You can also appeal through SASSA's official website. To initiate the appeal process, you must first confirm that you have read and agreed to the terms outlined in the Declaration and Consent Documents. Here's a step-by-step guide to filing your appeal: 1. Visit the SASSA SRD Appeal website and navigate to the appeals section. 2. Enter your 13-digit African ID card number and mobile number, which you provided during registration, then click "send pin." 3. Receive and enter the verification PIN sent to your registered mobile number on the website. 4. Log in to the appeal section using the entered PIN. 5. Select the month for which you're making an appeal; note that separate appeals are required for each rejected month. **Additional Requirements:** * Attach documents proving your eligibility, including: + Bank statements from the last six months + Residential proof + Identity documents + Other supporting documents to strengthen your case * Ensure all necessary documents are attached before submitting your application **Appeal Outcome and Next Steps:** * Your application will be submitted to the Independent Tribunal for review. * The tribunal typically takes 60-90 days to inform you of their decision. * If your appeal is declined, you have two options: + Appeal again to SASSA or ITSAA (not possible if previously rejected) + Take the matter to the High Court for a judicial review, which should be considered only if you believe your application was unfairly declined and meet all eligibility criteria. as deceased during the reconsideration period. alternative income source identified: This indicates that the applicant had a balance of R624 or more deposited into their bank account during the reconsideration period, signifying an alternative income source exceeding the grant's eligibility threshold. Reasons for cancellation include finding employment, change in financial circumstances, duplicate applications, or submitting an application in error due to not meeting the eligibility requirements. To cancel your SRD grant application, follow these steps: 1. Visit the SASSA SRD website and look for the "Cancel My Application" section. 2. Enter your ID number and phone number used during your SRD grant application to verify your identity and access your application. 3. You will receive a one-time PIN (OTP) via SMS, which you must enter into the designated field to proceed with verification. 4. After being verified, confirm the cancellation of your application by double-checking your information before proceeding. After canceling, SASSA will stop processing payments. If you have already received payments, you do not need to return the money, but future payments will cease. You can reapply for the SRD grant if your situation changes after cancellation. The applicant is unable to have another person cancel their SRD grant on their behalf due to privacy reasons. However, they are allowed to withdraw the application themselves for personal safeguard. It's also possible to cancel the grant if other grants are in place, mainly when the need for SRD grant diminishes. In such cases, reapplying might be necessary if circumstances change.
