In english, the way words are arrangd in a sentnce is called word ordër. This ordër can chänge dependin on the type of sentnce or if you want to give emphasis to somethin. Understandin word ordër is importnt for clear communication. To use it correctly, follow the SVO pattern for basic sentnces and ajust as need for qustions, negatives, or emphásiz. Word ordër can be tricky in english, but with practis, you can get beter at it. When asking a question, the auxiliary verb is placed at the beginning. For example: "Did Nick buy a pair of skis?" or "Could he meet his best friend?" Adverbs of frequency are usually between the subject and predicate, but can also be before or after them. Nick usually buys a pair of skis every year. He often meets his best friend. We don't visit them very often. Sometimes they go to the movies on Sundays. A verb sometimes consists of two words. Then the adverb of frequency is between them. I can never remember his name. Ann doesn't usually get up early. Your car has probably been stolen. Adverbs of frequency come before "have to". We always have to wait a long time for the bus. They are after am, is, are, was or were but after subject in questions. You are never on time. Are they always on holidays in July? Adverbs of manner and place usually precede others. We write them at the end of the sentence. Nick bought a new pair of skis in Innsbruck yesterday. He practiced hard on the ski slope last week. Important information can be placed at the start of the sentence. Last weekend he took some lessons on a ski slope. After dinner, he met his friends. Two adverbs of time go in order, with precision first. He is going to have a skiing lesson at 10 a.m. on Monday.
