1 Place the poles together with latches aligned. Swiffer WetJets consist of three parts, so ensure they are all properly lined up, including the mop on the bottom and the pole with handle at top. You will hear a click when they fit together.[1] Once assembled, disassembly can be quite difficult. 2 Open the battery compartment by pushing up on the tab in front middle section of base and sliding upwards to access new batteries. The compartment isn't easily accessible without this step. Insert four AA batteries into it.[2] If you just purchased WetJet, it may come with included batteries for use. Advertisement 3 Attach pad print side down. Many people make mistake by removing layer on back, which ruins cleaning pad. Instead, put pad down onto bottom and let it stick itself in place.[3] The stripe side will be facing floor when done correctly. 4 Insert cleaning solution bottle into pole with arrow aligned. Line up arrow on bottle with pole and slide until it clicks into place. If not clicking, press button on back while sliding down.[4] You don't need to remove cap from bottle. Advertisement 1 Use WetJet on finished hardwood, ceramic, vinyl, or laminate floors. It is suitable for most types of floors but avoid using on unsealed wood floors or carpeted floors. To check if your floor is sealed, place a few drops on inconspicuous area and watch for water absorption.[5] Instead use vacuuming for carpets and sweeping for unsealed wood floors. 2 Clean floor before mopping by sweeping or vacuuming to remove dust and hair. Use broom and dustpan, vacuum, or Swiffer sweeper for this task.[6] This ensures your mop can focus on hard-to-remove spills and stains. Mops aren't good at picking up solid debris while brooms aren't great at liquid spills. 3 Press button above handle to release cleaning solution. WetJet has a button that makes buzzing noise when pressed, releasing liquid onto floor.[8][9] If spraying becomes uneven or stops, change batteries. 4 Rub WetJet over damp area to remove grime. Apply gentle pressure while mopping by pushing Swiffer back and forth until clean. You can always spray again for particularly dirty spots. 5 Mop no more than once a week as over-mopping can cause dirt to stick to floors. Try to mop every other week or less often, depending on your needs. WetJet pads are designed to be disposable and should be replaced after each use. To do this, simply unpeel the dirty pad from the Swiffer and dispose of it in the trash. Then, attach a new pad to the bottom of the Swiffer by placing it on top. The key is to ensure that the printed side of the pad faces downwards, so that the striped area is in contact with the floor. Alternatively, you can create your own reusable cover for the Swiffer using an old shammy towel. Mark the length and width of the Swiffer pad on the towel, add 2 inches to each side, and cut out the excess fabric. Place the towel over the bottom of the Swiffer and tuck it in to create a custom fit. If you prefer not to make your own cover or buy replacement pads, you can purchase refill bottles for your Swiffer from Swiffer's official website or at stores like Walmart, Walgreens, or Home Depot.
