Page 4: Slope Operation A missing or damaged discharge cover can cause blade contact or thrown object injuries. Be aware of slopes and stop the blade when crossing them to avoid loss of control and tip-over. Page 5: Service Children Tragic accidents can occur if the operator is not alert to the presence of children. Children are often attracted to the machine and do not understand the dangers. Use extreme caution around children. Important Safety Information and Assembly Instructions for Riding Mower Product: READ MANUAL BEFORE USE! This product comes with safety symbols that need to be understood. It's crucial to read and follow all instructions in the manual before attempting assembly and operation. Symbols on the machine indicate potential dangers, so pay attention to them. DANGER - Gasoline is flammable. Allow the engine to cool for at least two minutes before refueling. WARNING - Carbon monoxide is deadly. Never run the engine indoors or in a poorly ventilated area. Assembly requires care. Tighten the shoulder bolt and lock nut using specific wrenches, then remove the pedestal cap mount hex screw from the steering console. Keep the screw for later use. Installing the mulch plug and deck chute is essential. Don't operate the tractor without them installed. The rear engine cover must be connected correctly, with equal tire pressure maintained at all times. The controls and features are located on the tractor, including the clutch/brake pedal, speed control & parking brake lever, fuel level indicator, ignition switch module, shift lever, fuel fill cap, throttle/choke lever, deck lift lever, cup holder, PTO (blade engage) lever, and oil fill cap. Read all safety rules and instructions before operating the machine. The shift lever is situated on the control panel, beneath the seat, and the Fuel Level Indicator is located below the seat on the left side of the tractor. This component has three positions: Forward, Reverse, and Neutral. Engaging the parking brake is crucial for safety; failure to do so can result in serious injury or death. To engage the parking brake safely: Fully depress the clutch-brake pedal and hold it down with your foot. Remove objects that could be thrown by the blades. Stopping the Engine: Shut off the engine and remove the key to minimize the risk of damage to your lawn. WARNING: If you strike a foreign object, stop the hot exhaust from your tractor's running engine immediately. Disconnect the spark plug wire and ground against the engine if necessary. Mulching: Once activated (indicator light ON), the tractor can be driven in reverse with the cutting blade engaged. A mulch kit has been supplied with your unit. Always look down and behind before and while backing to avoid accidents. Maintenance & Adjustments: Close the oil drain valve by rotating it clockwise, then reinstall the cap. Refill the engine with new motor oil as instructed in the Engine Owner's Manual. Lubricate the steering rack and pinion gear under the front of the unit every 25 hours of operation or once per season. Approximately 10 psi for rear tires and 14 psi for front tires can cause the brake to malfunction. Have your brakes properly adjusted by an authorized Troy-bilt Service Dealer. Off Season Storage: Drain the fuel from the tank, located on the left side of the engine, and may be attached with a tie strap. Never store lawn tractor indoors or in poorly ventilated areas where fuel fumes may reach an open flame. Removing the deck belt with the cutting deck still installed on the tractor can be tricky, but taking off the deck first makes it much easier. Then, you can change the deck belt and put the cutting deck back on. Be careful when jump-starting your mower's blades, though - never try to revive a damaged or frozen cutting blade. If that happens, turn off the engine, remove the battery, and make sure the vehicles aren't touching each other with their ignition keys off. Before removing any parts, be aware that some components require special tools (like an air/impact wrench) to change the tractor's drive belt. It might be a good idea to consult an authorized Troy-bilt Service Dealer or phone Customer Support for help on ordering a Service Manual. If your engine won't start, check if the PTO/Blade is engaged - simply place the blade engage lever in the disengaged (OFF) position. You can also look for a disconnected spark plug wire and reconnect it. If you're out of gas or have stale fuel, fill up with fresh, clean gasoline that's less than 30 days old. Be aware that this model is not designed for ground-engaging attachments. Lastly, familiarize yourself with the emission control warranty statement on your outdoor equipment engine. In California, new engines must meet the State's stringent anti-smog standards, while in other states, 1997 and later model year equipment must adhere to U.S. regulations.
