Each animal is described positively in the guidebook, promoting a re-evaluation of their importance in ecosystems and spirituality. While some elements might seem oversimplified or not perfectly alphabetical within sections, overall, the deck has broad appeal and great production quality. I deeply connect with this oracle deck, which brings me closer to nature and helps me rebalance my modern, fast-paced life. I have a high standard when selecting decks; they must resonate with their symbolism and design. This one's artwork, animal illustrations, and color palette captivate me. The inclusion of lesser-known animals and the card size/stock are also impressive. However, the guidebook falls short. While I appreciate the elemental categorization, I'm frustrated that the animals within each element aren't listed in alphabetical order. This lack of organization makes it difficult to navigate. Additionally, the explanations for each animal fail to resonate with me; instead, I've found myself referencing other spiritual texts. The deck's thought-provoking nature and card descriptions are what truly set it apart. The tips for balancing an animal's energy are valuable advice for maintaining a well-rounded life. When used consistently, this oracle deck can be a powerful tool for personal growth and self-reflection. I recently purchased the Animal Spirit Cards deck, which offers a unique approach to Tarot readings. Instead of using numbers within each suit, this deck employs a sort of hierarchy and features 7 spirit cards that correspond to each of the seven chakras. What caught my attention was the inclusion of mythical beings and the emphasis on connecting with nature. Although I didn't have any prior comparisons to base my assessment upon, I found the book fascinating and enjoyed using the cards for personal readings. My friend Sarah gifted me this deck after we encountered it together at a coffee shop, and I appreciate how accessible it is for beginners like myself. I've used it for annual readings, birthday celebrations with friends, and weekly reflections. Re-reading the opening pages recently resonated with me, particularly the quote "These cards are about receiving guidance from the natural world that helps us navigate life's complexity." I also appreciated the section on "The Nature Connection," where Kim encourages readers to approach the Animal Spirit Cards with a biological lens, putting aside previous assumptions and embracing their wild existence. As a scientist and naturalist, this deck's emphasis on building relationships with the more-than-human world resonated deeply with me. It has become an invaluable tool for slowing down, finding meaning, and expanding my heart and mind. I've enjoyed using it at work managing the gift shop at ZooMT, where many of the animals from the deck are present. The artwork is unique and lovely, featuring a blend of pointillism and watercolor techniques. Overall, I found this oracle deck and guidebook to be superb, with diverse animal selection and insightful writing. This mystical deck is divided into five suits, each representing a yogic element: Earth, Water, Fire, Air, and Ether. The Ether suit holds seven spirit cards, symbolizing the seven chakras of the subtle body. Each card represents an animal archetype that offers insight into relationships, personalities, and behaviors. From the majestic Peacock to the playful Dolphin, each animal has been carefully chosen for its symbolic potency and lesson at its core. The deck comes with a 200-page guidebook, offering grounded explanations of the cards and various spreads. This powerful tool for self-exploration is perfect for fans of The Wild Unknown Tarot Deck who want to deepen their practice and connect with the animal kingdom. The Fey Tarot deck is described as beautiful but lacking in content. The accompanying book provides vague descriptions of the card meanings, which are also condensed into minimal space. The reviewer praises the durability and quality of the cards themselves. They recommend this deck primarily for those with prior knowledge of tarot or who supplement it with other resources. This tarot guidebook presents itself as a personal, handwritten journal, evoking the sense that it's an unpolished first impression of the deck's meaning. The artwork is deceptively simple yet conveys primal energy, reminiscent of proto-Tarot decks before royal and pageant influences. The guidebook's structure makes the Court cards' rebranding as Daughter, Son, Mother, and Father more accessible. The deck and its accompanying book exude a wild, unknown quality, transporting users back to nature and the cave. The author's intentions are clear in their approach, aiming to introduce readers to the world of tarot without overwhelming them. The guidebook provides an excellent introduction, addressing initial questions and offering aesthetic appeal. However, some criticism is warranted as the book focuses on this specific deck and omits explanations for alternative interpretations. Additionally, there may be more depth to certain topics, such as reverse cards, which are glossed over in favor of other information. I love this deck as an art piece, but for a functional tarot deck, the images don't resonate with me and lack intuitive meaning. I often compare Kim Krans' images to traditional Rider Waite cards, trying to reconcile them, which doesn't help develop a connection with the deck. While I can enjoy readings with the book, I need it by my side to decipher the imagery. The deck's uniqueness is undeniable, especially its original take on the Tarot system and Kim Krans' distinctive voice in the text. She's a rare tarot artist who breaks from traditional lines. While there may be a few cards that don't resonate with me personally, such as the Father of Pentacles which looks more like a jackalope than a deer species, or the Magician with the cheetah, I still appreciate the overall beauty and simplicity of the deck. The companion book is equally impressive, featuring artistic design and concise information that allows for personal exploration. I found that the meanings of the cards didn't quite leap out at me when I initially looked at them, but after reading each card in the book, the interpretations became clear. This deck offers a lot of room for personal reading and interpretation, making it a great choice for those who want to delve deeper into their own thoughts and emotions. As for this deck, it's trendy but also intuitive and evocative. As a first-time reviewer, I felt compelled to share my thoughts after receiving these cards. I'd seen the deck online years ago and was thrilled to find a mass-market version. Initially, some comments made me cautious, but I opened the deck and was delighted with everything. The packaging is perfect, the card stock is great, and the illustrations are stunning. Overall, it's a beautiful, well-presented set. This tarot deck is okay, but its accompanying book lacks detail. It's a good starting point for newcomers, but it doesn't cover how to read upside-down cards. Not every user acknowledges these, so this might be an issue for some. If you're the type who does readings with both upright and inverted cards, you might want to look elsewhere. The deck is perfect for those who don't like to interpret tarot cards in unusual ways.
