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Nfl fantasy mock draft 2025

Print Does Jahmyr Gibbs belong in the first round of fantasy football drafts? This mock draft explores. By Matt Schau[Updated on Mon, Feb 3 2025 2:58 AM UTC Remember that time you drafted Christian McCaffrey first overall and he ruined your season? Of course you do. It was last year. And not too long ago, you'd get a few months to recover before deciding if you could draft him again. It's different now. Best ball drafts are already live for 2025 on some platforms. We're also working on our 2025 projections that will guide our fantasy football rankings. So why not go ahead and run our first fantasy football mock draft of the year? Jared, Kevin, Shane, and I got together, controlled three teams a piece, and ran through 10 rounds of a 12-team PPR fantasy football mock draft. Among the 120 selections, you'll find: nine incoming rookies (bolded)seven impending free agents (italicized)several WRs coming back from serious injuriesand likely more than a few picks that will surprise you In this mock draft, Jared had some key questions about his first-round pick Saquon Barkley. He led all RBs in PPR points per game last season despite receiving the 26th most targets among RBs. However, he ranked third at the position in expected points per game due to rushing volume (345 carries) and TD opportunity (fifth most expected TDs among RBs). Jared expects similar usage and production from Barkley in 2025.Kevin thinks Jahmyr Gibbs is a talent that belongs in the first round. He's just 23 years old and performed as an elite back down the stretch last season, even though he didn't have many targets. Kevin believes new OC Johnny Morton will feed Gibbs another 300ish touches in 2025, similar to Jamaal Charles-like efficiency.Matt is skeptical about Gibbs' prospects. He finished 2024 ranked just 24th in carries per game and RB17 in PPR points per game, despite having a high rush rate of 13.1 rushes per contest.Starting the year on lighter workloads for Breece Hall is a notable trend. He ended 2024 with the third-highest target count among running backs. His production in 2023 took place in an offense that was even weaker than this season's Jets (scoring 29th, yards 31st) compared to last year's dismal performance (24th in both). We'll see what the new coaching staff has planned for Hall's role in 2025. Despite being drafted as a top-3 RB ahead of 2024, he looks like a potential value if he falls to Round 2 this year.Fantasy Football Mock Draft: Round 21. Brian Thomas Jr., WR, Jacksonville Jaguars2. Alvin Kamara, RB, New OrleansHere's an analysis of some notable players and their potential for the upcoming season. Higgins, a free agent, was left off the list. However, several other quarterbacks were included. Daniels, who finished sixth among QBs in fantasy points per game last year, is seen as having significant upside. His ability to both pass and rush gives him an attractive combination of production and potential.In a recent mock draft, Mike Evans, D.J. Moore, Rashee Rice, and Chris Olave were all selected within the first five rounds. The consensus is that these players have significant fantasy value. Despite concerns about his health and potential suspension, Rice was taken in round four. His performance last year shows he has WR1 upside.In round five of another mock draft, several rookie running backs were picked alongside established players like Brandon Aiyuk and George Kittle. While some experts are skeptical about Aiyuk's ability to rebound from a disappointing 2024 season, there is hope that he will be healthy for the start of this year. If he can stay on the field, WR2 numbers could be within reach.Jake and Matt discuss the top WR prospects in fantasy football, including Jameson Williams, Jordan Addison, and Jakobi Meyers. They also analyze QBs like Patrick Mahomes and Deebo Samuel's potential. Kevin thinks Mahomes is a good value at the end of Round 6, while Matt expects him to be one of the top performers.The San Francisco 49ers' WR situation is about to get interesting with Deebo Samuel being a prime trade or cut candidate due to cap space issues. Meanwhile, Brandon Aiyuk will be returning from injury. At the same time, Browns Ricky Pearsall's production in 2024 was impressive, with 2.26 yards per route ranking him 14th among WRs and a PFF receiving grade that placed him 15th makes him a nice value at his WR42 price tag.There are also concerns about the RB situation in the NFL, with a heavy investment expected from teams in this draft. This could lead to playing time and jobs being lost by fringe RBs, even from late-round picks.Taylor, Saquon Barkley, or Derrick Henry will likely see their teams draft RBs between Rounds 2-4. Expect heated debate about RB ADP after the NFL Draft. His 2023 performance was solid, finishing third at the position in total fantasy points and fourth in points per game. Injury concerns are valid, but drafting injury insurance is easy and relatively common at QB.The Cowboys need to bolster their WR corps, which should make Prescott a more attractive option.Analysis Kevin: Prices were right on Xavier Legette and Jalen McMillan.Legette's expected to start in Year 2 after a decent rookie season.McMillan finished strong, scoring a league-high seven TDs, which could continue if Chris Godwin departs.Analysis Jared: Ben Johnson's improved play calling could unlock Caleb Williams' potential. The Bears offense has the necessary pieces for success, despite an underwhelming rookie season from Williams.Given article text here Looking forward to seeing everyone at the meeting tomorrow and discussing our strategies for a looning time around here. The team has developed some pretty clear guidelines for drafting teams. Now that we are a couple of weeks post-NFL draft, the dynasty drafts are flowing, predictions are being made, and hopes for our favorite rookies are at an all-time high. For this exercise, myself and other members of the NBC Sports/Rotoworld family have come together for an early redraft mock. This one is simple, with 12-person, PPR scoring where we start the following: QB, RB, RB, WR, WR, TE, FLEX, and four bench spots. However, he is the best running back in football and will be in fantasy this season as well. Denny Carter and Patrick Daugherty follow up with Chase and Justin Jefferson respectively.The second round of the draft saw several receivers go off the board from this point in picks 1.06-1.11. Kyle Dvorchak pulled the trigger on all-world tight end Brock Bowers at 1.12, giving him the "Travis Kelce" type treatment.Looking forward to the meeting tomorrow, where we'll see everyone and discuss our strategies in detail.Another player who could be of good value is Tyreek Hill who went one pick after CMC. Like round one of this draft there's a receiver run in the middle of the round (A.J. Brown, Drake London, Ladd McConkey and Jaxon Smith-Njigba). Of these guys, I like London to make the biggest leap and potentially be a top-five fantasy receiver as he quietly was fourth in receiving yards last season. The round ends with Bucky Irving, Terry McLaurin and Jonathan Taylor?? Am I missing something?Round 3 starts looking for late values because guys are too scared to identify them (did this trigger you?). I start off with Garrett Wilson as this mock draft starts three players at receiver, then we get Chase Brown and Trey McBride off the board. The middle of the round sees Lamar Jackson, Josh Allen then Jayden Daniels come off the board as those will be the top three consensus quarterbacks in fantasy. The round ends with DJ Moore, Davante Adams and Marvin Harrison Jr. being picked.Round 4 is where guys start to look for late values because people are too scared to identify them (did this trigger you?). I start off with Kyle Dvorchak as this mock draft starts with wide receivers then we get Rashee Rice and Zay Flowers off the board. The middle of the round sees Lamar Jackson, Jalen Hurts then Breece Hall come off the board as those will be the top five consensus quarterbacks in fantasy. The round ends with Xavier Worthy, Joe Burrow and Jameson Williams being picked.Round 5 starts looking for late values because guys are too scared to identify them (did this trigger you?). I start off with Lawrence Jackson as this mock draft starts three players at wide receiver then we get Kenneth Walker, Tetairoa McMillan and George Kittle off the board. The middle of the round sees James Cook, Joe Mixon and Chuba Hubbard come off the board as those will be the top five consensus running backs in fantasy. The round ends with Jordan Addison, T.J. Hockenson and Omarion Hampton being picked.Round 6 starts looking for late values because guys are too scared to identify them (did this trigger you?). I start off with Kyle Dvorchak as this mock draft starts three players at tight end then we get Baker Mayfield, R.J. Harvey and Jerry Jeudy off the board.Round four of the draft begins with uncertainty surrounding Chiefs' wide receiver Rashee Rice's injury and legal status. This pick could result in a steal or a disappointment. The Chiefs drafted Utah State receiver Jaylen Royals to mitigate the impact of Rice's situation. Back-to-back picks by Breece Hall and Kyren Williams at 4.04 and 4.05, respectively, raised my interest. On one hand, I think you're getting great value with Williams, who was a top-10 back in fantasy last season, with no apparent threat to reduce his touches except for Blake Corum and rookie Jarquez Hunter. Hall faces competition from Braelon Allen and Isaiah Davis, while new Jets head coach Aaron Glenn loves all of his running backs. The round concludes with two more quarterbacks (Jalen Hurts and Joe Burrow), followed by a receiver-heavy second half that includes Tetairoa McMillan, the first rookie receiver picked in this year's NFL draft.Round five begins with Chris Olave, hoping Spencer Rattler wins the starting quarterback job. Some notable values in this round include James Cook, Alvin Kamara, and Jaylen Waddle. Omarion Hampton went one pick ahead of Kamara, who will have Najee Harris to contend with at least for the first half of the season under Chargers head coach Jim Harbaugh's backfield deployment. The standout of this round is Travis Hunter, picked at 5.06, who has already been labeled an offensive player by the Jaguars' coaching staff. If Hunter receives 6-8 targets per game (or more), he will easily justify this investment.Baker Mayfield comes off the board in round six as the QB5 for his passing volume over the past couple of seasons. After a "come-back-down-to-earth" season from Sam LaPorta, he seems like a solid value in this round. This is a big round for rookie running backs, with both R.J. Harvey and TreVeyon Henderson going within three picks of each other. Harvey appears to have the clearer path to more touches at present, but Henderson should very well pay back the price of this pick with his versatility. The biggest question mark in this round is how good George Pickens can be now that he's a Cowboy? With a new offense and a significant quarterback upgrade, he's worth a shot at 6.06. I know fantasy football nerds hate Swift, but whos he losing massive touches to as of today? David Montgomery goes right after which is a great pick followed by Browns rookie Quinshon Judkins. I decided between those three. The one that came after that was one you may have to worry about in Isiah Pacheco. He could either bounce back or turn into a committee back, which is why he fell this far. Chris Godwin goes in this round as well and probably would go three rounds higher if not for an injury hes trying to come back from. Theres another couple of guys whod go four or five rounds higher if it were three years ago in Mark Andrews and Travis Kelce. Neither can be trusted as the elite options they once were. The round ends with zone runner Kaleb Johnson who has a chance to take over Harris role from last season in Pittsburgh.In the next couple of rounds most of us are trying to gather WR3s, WR4s and running backs we hope to use in our FLEX spots. Players like Deebo Samuel, Jayden Reed and Cooper Kupp are looking to regain the form that once made them fantasy must-starts. Running backs Najee Harris and Brian Robinson go in the middle of the eighth round and both have double-digit touchdowns within their range of outcomes. I took Justin Fields as my starting quarterback at the top of the ninth knowing hell get the full season as a starter. I took him over Kyler Murray who could end up being the better pick. Campbell adds range and explosiveness to the Buccaneers' defense next to Lavonte David. The Broncos need a running back, which Hampton fulfills with his physicality, productivity, and ability to carry the load immediately. Green gives Pittsburgh another rotational pass rusher, while Harmon fortifies the Chargers' interior with early-down reliability. Barron fills a need in the Packers' young secondary, Emmanuor sets the tone for Minnesota's box defense, Simmons boosts the Texans up front, Egbuka diversifies the Rams' receiver room, Starks adds ball-hawking skills to the Ravens, and Dart becomes the Giants' quarterback of the future. Booker brings physicality to Washington's guard position, Johnson gives Buffalo a long-term answer at corner, Conerly fits Kansas City's need at left tackle.Ezeiraku embodies the qualities Philadelphia seeks in an edge player, bringing leverage and a sense of urgency to his game, which makes him a suitable fit, while also providing additional rotational depth to a defensive front known for frequently rotating players.

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
