## Verbalizing and visualizing structure words

### What is visualizing and verbalizing. Does visualizing and verbalizing work. Visualizing and verbalizing worksheets pdf.

Here are some worksheets for students familiar with the Visualizing and Verbalizing structure words. These were created during school cancellations to provide at-home practice for my students. Additionally, a free visual was sent home using a downloaded resource from Teachers Pay Teachers, which helps reinforce the structure words. An email was also sent to parents/guardians outlining specific goals and activity ideas for supporting their child's speech and language development during the school closures. The email encouraged setting up video calls to implement activities together, making it easier to continue on one's own. Key goals include continuing work with Visualizing and Verbalizing steps 1-3, which use simple pictures for visualization and "structure words" as a framework for description. Future plans involve expanding to visualizing words, sentences, and paragraphs. Some examples of activities that can be done at home include: \* Familiarizing yourself with the structure words using the attached document "V&V Structure Words Visual", which includes questions to ask about pictures. \* Using worksheets (attached) that feature pictures and structure words, guiding your child through completion while referring to the "V&V Structure Words Visual". \* Displaying simple pictures from books or the internet, then asking your child to describe them using the structure words. A free printable set of cards was also made available as a supplementary resource to reinforce the Lindamood Bell Visualizing and Verbalizing kit. Challenges with hyperlexic kids include language comprehension, but efforts using this program have shown great improvement over the past year. I received the Visualizing and Verbalizing Kit to review with my son, who learns differently. To make it more effective, I adapted some elements to fit his learning style better. One supplement I created was language comprehension cards, which have been helpful so far. The kit is designed to improve reading comprehension by building concept imagery. The Lindamood Bell Visualizing and Verbalizing Kit helps kids with hyperlexia who struggle to create mental images while reading. Here's an overview of the program: [insert links]. A key part of the program is a list of 12 structure words, which provide a framework for visualizing, verbalizing, and writing. I created language comprehension cards as an alternative to the kit's printed materials, which are not ideal for carrying around. You can download these free printable cards: [insert link].
