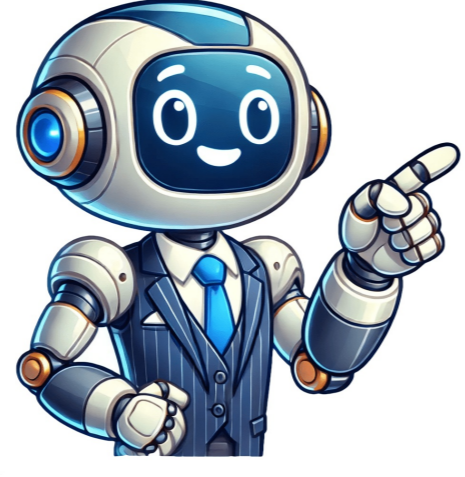

To travel internationally, citizens of Barbados need a passport, and this article explains how to apply for one and take a compliant photo. There are two ways to apply: at the Immigration Department in Barbados if you're in the country, or at a diplomatic or consular mission if you're abroad. For applications inside the country, you can book an appointment online. The required documents vary by age group. For under 16s, you need a completed Form B, two passport photos, birth certificate, parent's ID, and proof of name change if applicable, with a fee of B\$100. For those 16 and over, you need a completed Form A, two passport photos, birth certificate, parent's ID, marriage or divorce documents if applicable, and a fee of B\$150. Passport photos must meet specific requirements: 5x5 cm size, plain white background, modest dress code, and no bold hair colors or jewelry. Prescription glasses are allowed if they don't obscure eyes, but sunglasses are not permitted. Photos must be recent, in color, and printed on matte paper with no distortions or marks. You can get your passport photo online, ensuring it meets all the necessary criteria for a successful application. Just take a selfie with good lighting and proper pose, like explained before, to help Visafoto make your Barbados passport application go smoothly. Barbados passports can be obtained outside of the country for \$225, with varying fees depending on the location. The standard passport size is B7 (ISO/IEC 7810 ID-3), measuring 88 mm x 125 mm, and consists of 32 pages, with the option to issue more pages to frequent travelers. The booklet features a dark blue cover with the CARICOM logo, followed by the words "CARIBBEAN COMMUNITY" and "BARBADOS." The Barbados coat of arms is prominently displayed on the center page, along with the inscription "PASSPORT" or "DIPLOMATIC PASSPORT," depending on the type. The identification page includes information such as the passport holder's photo, nationality (Barbados citizenship), date of birth, and national identification number. The standards for passport photos are 5 cm x 5 cm, with a full-face view, open eyes, closed mouth, and natural expression. The background should be white, with no shadows or face obstructions. The inside cover of the passport contains words in English only, stating that the bearer is allowed to pass freely without let or hindrance, and to receive every assistance and protection they may need. As of July 2022, Barbadian citizens had visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to 163 countries and territories, ranking their passports 23rd in terms of travel freedom according to the Henley visa restrictions index. The passport allows holders to travel without a visa or receive one upon arrival to many other countries. In 2009, Barbados signed a short-stay visa waiver agreement with the European Union, allowing citizens to visit member states for up to three months in any six-month period without a visa. The Barbadian passport, a symbol of citizenship for the island nation, has undergone several changes in its design and features over the years. Initially issued as a document for citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies in the 1960s, it later evolved to include characteristics specific to Barbadians. The Caribbean Community Barbados Passport was introduced between 2007 and 2018, featuring an international bio-metric symbol. A new design variant with republican features was introduced after 2018, with a further update in 2021 following the country's transition to a republic. Visa requirements for Barbadian citizens vary depending on individual circumstances. The Henley & Partners Visa Restrictions Index provides insights into visa policies across regions. As a member of the Commonwealth and a Caribbean Community (CARICOM) nation, Barbados' foreign relations are shaped by these organizations. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade oversees these matters, while the Government Information Service (G.O.B.) provides updates on official policies. Recent changes to passport fees and immigration procedures have been implemented, with the implementation of an e-passport in 2018. Design features, such as colors, have also undergone revisions. The Barbados Immigration Department is responsible for issuing passports and providing information on application processes.
